On Otober 4, 2017, Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) filed its First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification of Information Contained in MFR D-2. On March 15, 2016, FPL filed its MFRs in the above referenced docket. Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), FPL requested confidential classification of certain information provided in the MFR Schedules listed in the following table.

By Order No. PSC-16-0133-CFO-EI, dated April 4, 2016, the Commission granted FPL's March 15, 2016 request. The period of confidential treatment (18 months) granted by Order 0133 expires on October 4, 2017. FPL claims that the information contained in the MFR D-2 must remain confidential.

Staff reviewed FPL's request and in staff's opinion, the information subject to the request meets the criteria for confidential classification pursuant to Section 366.093, F.S., and Rule 25-22.006, F.A.C., and should still be treated as confidential. Therefore, staff recommends that FPL's first request for extension of confidential classification be approved.
