As an FP&L customer, I oppose FP&L's request to saddle ratepayers with \$200 million to clean up water contamination from its Turkey Hill power plant.

In addition, I support Florida state Sen. Jose Javier Rodriguez' legislation introduction to block FP&L from passing the clean up costs onto its customers.

Florida Power & Light receives a very large rate of return from its customers because their shareholders claim they take "risks". However, whenever "risks" turn to actual losses, FP&L run to FPSC to stick ratepayers with those losses. It is time for FP&L shareholders to bear the losses of their "risks" themselves.
