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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	THE CHAIRMAN: Item 5 15.
3	MS. OLLILA: Item 15 is a petition from
4	Peoples Gas to approve its cast iron/bare steel
5	replacement and problematic plastic pipe surcharges
6	for 2018. For 2018, the proposed surcharge for a
7	typical residential customer is a \$1.06.
8	There have been no customer contacts. Staff
9	recommends approval. And staff notes that
10	representatives from the company and Public Counsel
11	are here.
12	THE CHAIRMAN: Hello. Hello. Good morning.
13	Ms. Christensen, would you like to address the
14	Commission on this one, too? Ditto?
15	MS. CHRISTENSEN: Yes, I would. And we do
16	have some brief comments regarding Peoples Gas bare
17	iron/steel pipe replacement problem. And it's
18	as we said before, we do not object to the safety-
19	related issues. We we support that.
20	My understanding, however, from the petition
21	and information provided is that the utility also
22	has been highly aggressive in replacing the cast
23	iron and bare steel and, now, with the problematic
24	plastic pipe replacement portions of program.
25	Again, the projected investment costs for 2016

1	are approximately 35.6 million, which is
2	approximately 85 percent greater than the costs
3	were for the previously-project were previously
4	projected for 2017.
5	So, while we recognize that the plastic pipe
6	replacement costs will increase the total cost over
7	the term of the program, we wanted to make sure
8	that the cost will continue to undergo the
9	necessary scrutiny to make sure that the only
10	the appropriate costs for these programs are being
11	collected via the pipeline replacement surcharge.
12	Our expectations have been, and continue to
13	be, that the right of recovery would be balanced by
14	reasonable bill impacts with the appropriately-
15	aggressive safety measures.
16	And that's concludes our comments. Thank
17	you.
18	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Ms. Christensen.
19	And I would like to hear from Peoples Gas,
20	but I I did notice that, too, in this particular
21	docket as well.
22	MR. BROWN: Andy Brown with the Law firm of
23	Macfarlane, Ferguson & McMullen in Tampa. I'm here
24	with Kandi Floyd, the manager of regulatory for
25	Peoples Gas, and Rick Wall, vice president of

1	operations. And we are here to answer any
2	questions that the Commission may have.
3	THE CHAIRMAN: All right. Thank you.
4	Commissioners, any questions on this?
5	Commissioner Polmann.
6	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, Madam
7	Chairman.
8	I think this is a question for staff. Can
9	I can I please have a clarification the title
10	for this item refers to 2016, '17, and '18. Maybe
11	I just don't understand. The issues stated the
12	specific to 2018 can you please clarify the
13	distinction there for '16 and '17?
14	MS. OLLILA: You're correct, Commissioner.
15	'16 is the final is the final true-up for
16	2016 feeds into 2017, which is an actual and
17	estimated true-up. And the number that comes out
18	of the 2017 actual estimated true-up is used in
19	calculating the surcharge amount for 2018.
20	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. So, if I
21	understand, the 2018 is the surcharge, and that
22	maybe not the right word, but it's the follow-on
23	or a or a carry-forward from the prior two
24	years?
25	MS OLLILA: Well it includes the effect of

1 any over- or under-recoveries. 2 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. So, the action 3 here today is -- is the 2018. And that takes care 4 of the prior two years; and hence, that's the --5 the purpose --6 MS. OLLILA: Yes, sir. 7 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: -- for the -- for the 8 title. 9 MS. OLLILA: Yes, sir. 10 So, the action here COMMISSIONER POLMANN: 11 takes care of everything. 12 MS. OLLILA: Yes, sir, I --13 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. 14 MS. OLLILA: The -- yes. 15 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. 16 Thank you so much, Madam Chair. 17 THE CHAIRMAN: All right. Commissioners, any 18 other questions? 19 I do just have a question about this. it's -- it looks like, from the recommendation, 20 21 that by 2021, all of the -- all of the pipe is 22 going to be replaced; is that right? 23 MS. FLOYD: Good morning, Commissioners. 24 Kandi Floyd with Peoples Gas System. 25 By 2021, we anticipate all the cast iron and

1	bare steel to be removed from the system. We had a
2	depreciation settlement that was approved last year
3	that included polyethylene plastic pipe, otherwise
4	known as problematic plastic pipe. We will
5	continue to replace that pipe through 2028.
6	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, that's great, though, on
7	the bare-steel side and cast iron.
8	MS. FLOYD: Commissioner or Chairman Brown,
9	may I make a comment to as far as in response
10	to OPC?
11	THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.
12	MS. FLOYD: Thank you. I just wanted to
13	affirm that Peoples is we are taking a very
14	active approach for replacing the cast iron and
15	bare steel in our system and also the polyethylene
16	pipe. And of course, we are doing this to to
17	ensure safe, reliable system for our customers.
18	I do want to comment that and we we
19	recognize the comments by OPC. We're very mindful
20	of the spending levels. And we note that 2018 will
21	be a peak spending year for Peoples Gas.
22	And then, beyond that, we will see those
23	spending levels decrease because of the because
24	of the replacement activity and the removal of cast
25	iron.

1	We do want to be good stewards, obviously, of
2	this program. And we want to continue to look for
3	ways to to have cost savings and cost measures
4	during this program. And I just wanted to make
5	these comments in in regards to
6	Ms. Christensen's
7	THE CHAIRMAN: I'm happy you did. Thank you.
8	That that was elucidated all of the concerns
9	here, so
10	MS. FLOYD: Thank you.
11	THE CHAIRMAN: Commissioners, ripe for a
12	motion now.
13	COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Move staff
14	recommendation.
15	THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second?
16	COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Second.
17	THE CHAIRMAN: Any discussion?
18	Seeing none, all those in favor, say aye.
19	(Chorus of ayes.)
20	THE CHAIRMAN: Motion passes.
21	Thank you for bringing all this to our
22	attention.
