1	25-30.4575 Operating Ratio Methodology.
2	(1) Operating ratio methodology is an alternative to the traditional calculation of revenue
3	requirement. Under this methodology, instead of calculating the revenue requirement based
4	on a rate of return on the utility's rate base, the revenue requirement includes the utility's
5	operation and maintenance expenses plus a margin of 15 percent of the utility's operation and
6	maintenance expenses.
7	(2) In rate cases processed under Section 367.0814, F.S., the Commission will determine
8	whether the operating ratio methodology will be used to establish the utility's revenue
9 10	requirement. When determining whether the operating ratio methodology will be used, the
10	Commission will consider the following factors:
11	(a) Whether the utility's rate base is less than the utility's operation and maintenance
13	expenses or is negative.
14	(b) Whether the use of the operating ratio methodology changes the utility's qualification
15	for a staff assisted rate case under Rule 25-30.455(1), F.S. If the use of the operating ratio
16	methodology would cause the utility to no longer qualify for a staff assisted rate case under
17	Rule 25-30.455(1), F.S., the operating ratio methodology will not be used to establish the
18	utility's revenue requirement.

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# 25-30.433 Rate Case Proceedings.

2	In a rate case proceeding, the following provisions shall apply, unless the applicant or any
3	intervenor demonstrates that these rules result in an unreasonable burden. In these instances,
4	fully supported alternatives will be considered by the Commission. Any alternatives proposed
5	by the utility must be filed with the minimum filing requirements.
6	(1) The Commission in every rate case shall make a determination of the quality of service
7	provided by the utility by evaluating the. This shall be derived from an evaluation of three
8	separate components of water and wastewater utility operations: quality of the utility's product
9	(water and wastewater); operational conditions of utility's plant and facilities; and the utility's
10	attempt to address customer satisfaction. In making this determination, the Commission shall
11	consider:
12	(a) Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and county health department
13	inspections, including second surveys, for water systems and compliance evaluation
14	inspections for wastewater systems;
15	(b) DEP and county health department outstanding citations, violations and consent orders
16	on file with the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and county health
17	departments or lack thereof over the preceding 3-year period; shall also be considered.
18	(c) DEP and county health department officials' testimony concerning quality of service as
19	well as; and
20	(d) <u>T</u> the testimony of <u>the</u> utility's customers shall be considered.
21	(2) In order to ensure safe, efficient, and sufficient service to utility customers, the
22	Commission shall consider whether the operational conditions of the plant and facilities are in
23	compliance with Rule 25-30.225, F.A.C.
24	(3)(2) Working capital for Class A utilities shall be calculated using the balance sheet
25	approach. Working capital for Class B and C utilities shall be calculated using the formula
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1	method (one-eighth of operation and maintenance expenses).
2	(4)(3) Used and useful debit deferred taxes shall be offset against used and useful credit
3	deferred taxes in the capital structure. Any resulting net debit deferred taxes shall be included
4	as a separate line item in the rate base calculation. Any resulting net credit deferred taxes shall
5	be included in the capital structure calculation. No other deferred debits shall be considered in
6	rate base when the formula method of working capital is used.
7	(5)(4) The averaging method used by the Commission to calculate rate base and cost of
8	capital shall be a 13-month average for Class A utilities and the simple beginning and end-of-
9	year average for Class B and C utilities.
10	(6)(5) Non-used and useful adjustments shall be applied to the applicable depreciation
11	expense. Property tax expense on non-used and useful plant shall not be allowed.
12	(7)(6) Charitable contributions shall not be recovered through rates.
13	(8)(7) Income tax expense shall not be allowed for subchapter S corporations, partnerships
14	or sole proprietorships.
15	(9)(8) Non-recurring expenses shall be amortized over a 5-year period unless a shorter or
16	longer period of time can be justified.
17	(10)(9) The amortization period for forced abandonment or the prudent retirement, in
18	accordance with the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners Uniform
19	System of Accounts, of plant assets prior to the end of their depreciable life shall be calculated
20	by taking the ratio of the net loss (original cost less accumulated depreciation and
21	contributions-in-aid-of-construction (CIAC) plus accumulated amortization of CIAC plus any
22	costs incurred to remove the asset less any salvage value) to the sum of the annual
23	depreciation expense, net of amortization of CIAC, plus an amount equal to the rate of return
24	that would have been allowed on the net invested plant that would have been included in rate
25	base before the abandonment or retirement. This formula shall be used unless the specific CODING: Words <u>underlined</u> are additions; words in <del>struck through</del> type are deletions from existing law.
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1 circumstances surrounding the abandonment or retirement demonstrate a more appropriate

2 amortization period.

<u>(11)(10)</u> A utility is required to <u>have the right of access and continued use of own</u> the land
upon which the utility treatment facilities are located, or possess the right to the continued use
of the land, such as a 99-year lease. Documentation of continued use shall be in the form of a
recorded warranty deed, recorded quit claim deed accompanied by title insurance, recorded
lease such as a 99-year lease, or recorded easement. The Commission may consider a written
easement or other cost-effective alternative.

9 (12)(11) In establishing an authorized rate of return on common equity, a utility, in lieu of
10 presenting evidence, may use the current leverage formula adopted by Commission order. The
11 equity return established shall be based on the equity leverage order in effect at the time the
12 Commission decides the case.

13 (13)(12) Nonutility investment should be removed directly from equity when reconciling
14 the capital structure to rate base unless the utility can show, through competent evidence, that
15 to do otherwise would result in a more equitable determination of the cost of capital for
16 regulatory purposes.

17 (14)(13) Interest expense to be included in the calculation of income tax expense shall be 18 the amount derived by multiplying the amount of the debt components of the reconciled 19 capital structure times the average weighted cost of the respective debt components. Interest 20 expense shall include an amount for the parent debt adjustment in those cases covered by Rule 21 25-14.004, F.A.C. Interest shall also be imputed on deferred investment tax credits in those 22 cases covered by 26 CFR Part 1, s. 1.46-6(b)(2)(i), (3) and (4)(ii) issued May 22, 1986 and 23 effective for property constructed or acquired on or after August 15, 1971. 24 Rulemaking Authority 350.127(2), 367.121, 367.1213 FS. 7	1. Customer demand for water transmission and distribution systems shall be the number
8	of ERCs connected to these systems, as defined in Rule 25-30.515(8)(b), F.A.C.
9	a. Non-residential connections should be assigned a number of ERCs proportional to their
10	flows compared to average residential flows.
11	b. Customer demand shall include a growth allowance as defined in Rule 25-30.431,
12	<u>F.A.C.</u>
13	c. For systems serving only single-family residences, customer demand shall be the
14	maximum number of lots served by the utility during the test year, plus a growth allowance as
15	defined in Rule 25-30.431, F.A.C., using the historical number of lots connected as the basis

5	5. There are no areas of the water transmission or distribution system which could be
6	wholly removed without impacting the ability to reliably serve customers more than five full
7	years after the end of the test year.
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10	(2) The Commission shall make a U&U calculation for a utility's wastewater collection
11	system to establish the cost of providing service.
12	(a) The U&U calculation for a wastewater collection system is made by dividing the
13	customer demand by the maximum capacity of the system.
14	1. Customer demand for a wastewater collection system shall be the number of ERCs
15	connected to the system, as defined in Rule 25-30.515(8)(b), F.A.C.
16	a. Non-residential connections should be assigned a number of ERCs proportional to their
17	estimated flows compared to average residential flows.
18	b. Customer demand shall include a growth allowance as defined in Rule 25-30.431,
19	<u>F.A.C.</u>
20	c. For systems serving only single-family residences, customer demand shall be the
21	maximum number of lots served by the utility during the test year, plus a growth allowance as
