1 P R O C E E D I N G S

2 COMMISSIONER BROWN: We are moving on to Issue
3 3 -- Item 3. Good afternoon, Mr. Morgan.

4 MR. MORGAN: Good afternoon, Commissioners.
5 Charles Morgan with Commission staff. Item 3 is
6 Florida Power & Light's petition for modifications
7 to its curtailable service tariffs. The company is
8 seeking to institute a 30-day notice for the
9 current curtailable-service customers to transfer
10 to its commercial, industrial demand-reduction
11 rider. Both tariffs are non-firm demand options
12 for commercial customers who are willing to curtail
13 a portion of their demand in exchange for a monthly
14 credit.

15 CDR offers greater benefits to the company and
16 ratepayers in the form of increased load control.
17 And this petition offers an efficient transfer to
18 that program.

19 The company states that no new participants
20 have signed up for curtailable service since 2010
21 and have, therefore, requests to close that tariff
22 to new customers.

23 Staff has submitted an oral modification to
24 the recommendation on January 3rd, 2018. Staff is
25 prepared to read the modification at this time.

1 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Go ahead, please.

2 MR. MORGAN: The modification affects Issue 1,
3 Page 3, second paragraph under the subheading
4 "FPL's proposal."

5 And staff replaced the fourth sentence, which
6 read, "The credits provided to customers under both
7 tariffs are recovered by the company as demand-side
8 management programs through the energy conservation
9 cost recovery clause," and we replaced that with,
10 "The credits provided to customers through the CS
11 tariffs are recovered by the company in base rates
12 while the CDR credits are recovered through the
13 energy conservation cost recovery clause."

14 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.

15 So, I see that we have representatives from
16 FPL and FIPUG here today. Would you like to
17 address us?

18 MR. BAKER: Good afternoon, Chair,
19 Commissioners. My name is Joel Baker. I represent
20 FPL in this matter. And I'm joined today by Will
21 Cox here, who is also counsel for FPL.

22 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Welcome to the
23 Commission.

24 MR. BAKER: Thank you very much.

25 COMMISSIONER BROWN: You're welcome.

1 MR. BAKER: And we're here to support staff's
2 recommendation and to answer any questions that the
3 Commissioners may have.

4 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.

5 Hi. Happy New Year --

6 MR. MOYLE: Well -- well --

7 COMMISSIONER BROWN: -- Mr. Moyle.

8 MR. MOYLE: Thank you. And Happy New Year to
9 you and the Commission. Jon Moyle on behalf of the
10 Florida Industrial Power Users Group.

11 And I would just -- just make a comment. You
12 know, a lot of times you see FIPUG and other
13 intervenors in -- in contested matters and taking
14 positions that, you know, we say, take a left turn,
15 and others may say, take a right turn. But we have
16 a lot of discussions with utilities that are not
17 before this Commission. We try to engage in
18 constructive dialogue with them about issues
19 that -- that we can work together on.

20 And I wanted to just echo FIPUG's support for
21 this and to thank, publicly, FPL for being
22 receptive to the idea of making -- making this
23 change that we think is good public policy.

24 It's consistent with energy efficiency and --
25 in measures that would allow people to continue to

1 have interruptible service, but not have to -- to
2 wait three years to move from one form of
3 interruptible service to another.

4 So, we're -- we're very supportive of it, but
5 wanted to just state those comments that we
6 appreciate FPL working with FIPUG and its member
7 companies on this issue.

8 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you, Mr. Moyle.

9 Commissioners, any questions of -- if not,
10 ready for a motion.

11 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Move staff recommendation.

12 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Second.

13 COMMISSIONER BROWN: All those in favor, say
14 aye.

15 (Chorus of ayes.)

16 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Motion passes. Thank
17 you.

18 MR. BAKER: Thank you.

19 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you for being here.

20 (Agenda item concluded.)
