When we moved here in 2010, the first thing we had to do was to buy an expensive water unit so this smelly, bad tasting water wouldn't make us ill. Even with the water cleansing unit, the smell is getting worse. After the hurricane hit, the sewer in front of our house kept spewing sewer water all over the road and on our yard. Just driving our cart around Wedgefield makes us sick. The sewer smell is awful! No matter how many times Pluris sent out a crew to fix the sewer, ^{during the hurricane,} sewer water ~~is~~ spewing out. (3 times this happened) We want Pluris to go back to NC & let us have OCU! before we die. We don't even let our dog drink the water from the spicket. Our dog drinks our filtered water only!
