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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Item No. 8.
3	MS. DANIEL: Good morning, Commissioners.
4	Patti Daniel on behalf of Staff. Item 8 is a
5	petition filed by Utilities, Inc. of Florida to
6	collect additional contributions in aid of
7	construction from developers and future customers
8	as a result in the change in the tax law. Cash and
9	property contributions received by water and waste
10	water utilities are now taxable income.
11	Utilities, Inc. is seeking recovery of the
12	additional income tax that will result from the
13	change in the tax law, subject to refund and
14	pending resolution of a separate docket in which
15	the Commission is examining the impacts of the
16	change in the tax law, there have been no customer
17	inquiries and I don't believe the utility is
18	intending to speak on this today.
19	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Commissioners, any
20	questions of Staff on Item No. 8?
21	Commissioner Brown.
22	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you. And thank
23	you, Ms. Daniel. Can you talk about the true-up
24	process and when you anticipate that to occur?
25	Would that occur simultaneously with the resolution

1	of the generic docket, or would it be an annual
2	thing?
3	MS. DANIEL: I think within the investigation
4	docket, those decisions will be made as to when and
5	how that true-up will occur.
б	COMMISSIONER BROWN: And how do we know if the
7	tariff is actually reasonable and fair?
8	MS. DANIEL: We've looked at the change in the
9	tax law and we also have had the same situation
10	occur back in the late '80s where, for a short
11	period of time, Congress made the contributions in
12	aid of construction-taxable income, so we have a
13	point of reference as to the formulas that were
14	used.
15	The formula requested by Utilities, Inc. of
16	Florida is the most-liberally construed formula.
17	It would allow the utility to collect basically 33
18	percent on top of any cash or property
19	contributions. It is subject to refund and
20	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thirty-three percent?
21	MS. DANIEL: It's a 33 percent markup when you
22	do the tax on the tax, as well, because when you
23	collect the tax as a part of the CIC, that also
24	becomes taxable income. So it marks it up 33
25	percent. That's the most-liberal formula. There

1	are other formulas that came out of proceedings
2	that occurred in the '80s and '90s that had
3	variations.
4	COMMISSIONER BROWN: But then again we will
5	have an opportunity during the generic docket to
6	investigate this further?
7	MS. DANIEL: Correct.
8	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thanks.
9	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioner Polmann.
10	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, Mr.
11	Chairman. Commissioner Brown raised the question
12	and your response on this to 33 percent to that
13	point is, do we have does Staff have the
14	opportunity to, in review of this request, consider
15	or make a recommendation as to the 33 percent and
16	offer or recommend a different percentage, or is
17	this simply we're authorizing the gross-up
18	inclusive of the 33 percent and then the true-up
19	comes later and does the analysis? Is there any
20	opportunity for a different percentage to be
21	approved?
22	MS. DANIEL: Today or down are you speaking
23	as
24	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: In this action here
25	today.

1	MS. DANIEL: In this action. Today you can
2	either approve or deny the company's tariff filing.
3	If you wanted to deny it, what you might consider
4	doing is suggesting what you would accept as a
5	change and then offering Staff the opportunity to
6	approve that administratively if the utility were
7	to file the tariff reflecting that.
8	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. But in your
9	answer to Commissioner Brown, in any case, the
10	analysis and the true-up to be done later will
11	MS. DANIEL: Will take care of all of that.
12	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Will do the full
13	analysis and the numbers will be audited or
14	examined later?
15	MS. DANIEL: That's correct.
16	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: And be corrected as
17	needed with and all of this is subject to
18	refund?
19	MS. DANIEL: That's correct.
20	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you.
21	MS. DANIEL: And the other side of the coin is
22	that you don't want the utility to find that they
23	collected less than they might potentially have
24	needed and not have the opportunity to go back to a
25	developer.

1	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you. That's all
2	I have, Mr. Chairman.
3	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioner Clark.
4	COMMISSIONER CLARK: In response kind of in
5	response to Commissioner Polmann's question, Ms.
6	Daniel, could you break down the 33? There was 21
7	percent was corporate then you had gross receipts.
8	How does that break down percentage-wise?
9	MS. DANIEL: There's a formula. I can do
10	this. Let's me see if I have a copy of the tariff.
11	I do. I do. On the back of the recommendation in
12	Attachment A, what you're doing is you're basically
13	dividing 21 percent plus the five percent-ish
14	let's see, federal income state income taxes are
15	deductible on your federal tax returns so it's sort
16	of a mish-mash, but it's basically 25 percent
17	divided by one, minus 25 percent or 75 percent.
18	Twenty-five percent divided by 75 percent is
19	33 percent. That's the bottom.
20	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Thank you.
21	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any further questions?
22	Seeing none, I'll entertain a motion.
23	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: I move Staff
24	recommendation.
25	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: It's been moved and

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          seconded. Staff recommendation Item No. 8.
