2	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Good afternoon. Today
3	is March 12, 2018. And as best we can tell, it's
4	1:30. Some of us are not quite sure about that.
5	I will now call this prehearing conference to
6	order. We are here for Docket Number 2010179-GU,
7	Florida City Gas petition for rate increase.
8	I will look to staff and ask you please read
9	the notice.
10	MR. TRIERWEILER: By notice issued
11	February 5th, 2018, this time and place was set for
12	this prehearing conference in Docket Number
13	20170179-GU. The purpose of this prehearing is set
14	out in the notice.
15	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you,
16	Mr. Trierweiler.
17	At this point, we will take appearances, and
18	we will start with Florida City Gas.
19	MS. KEATING: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
20	Beth Keating with the Gunster law firm, also here
21	with Greg Munson. We are here on behalf of Florida
22	City Gas.
23	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: And FEA.
24	MR. JERNIGAN: Yes, sir. Thomas Jernigan with
25	the Federal Executive Agencies. Thank you.

1	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: OPC.
2	MS. PONDER: Yes. Virginia Ponder with the
3	Office of Public Counsel. I would also like to
4	make an appearance for Patty Christensen, Stephanie
5	Morse and J.R. Kelly, the Public Counsel.
6	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you.
7	Okay, Commission staff.
8	MR. TRIERWEILER: Walt Trierweiler. Also with
9	me today are Danijela Janjic, Margo DuVal and
10	Jennifer Crawford.
11	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: And General Counsel's
12	Office.
13	MS. HELTON: Mary Anne Helton here as your
14	advisor today. I would also like to make an
15	appearance for your General Counsel, Keith Hetrick.
16	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you.
17	Staff, I understand we have preliminary
18	matters that need to be addressed before we proceed
19	at this point.
20	MR. TRIERWEILER: Yes, Commissioner.
21	I am glad to say staff has a few items to
22	address on today, March 12, 2018.
23	The parties filed a joint motion for the
24	approval of a settlement agreement that resolves
25	all issues identified in this proceeding. This has

2	Exhibit No. 107. At the request of the parties,
3	depositions planned for March 6th through 8th were
4	postponed.
5	Staff recommends an amended procedural order
6	be issued to guide the activities of the parties
7	until the technical hearing on March 26, 2018,
8	immediately following the Gulf settlement in Docket
9	Number 20180039-EI at 1:30 p.m.
10	At this time, staff would request that we
11	adjourn the prehearing to provide Commission staff
12	with the opportunity to examine the contents of the
13	settlement agreement.
14	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you,
15	Mr. Trierweiler.
16	At this time, I believe it would be it
17	would be appropriate to allow staff the necessary
18	time to examine the proposed settlement agreement.
19	And, as Mr. Trierweiler indicated, I will be
20	issuing an amended order that will outline the next
21	steps in this docket.
22	Subsequent to adjournment here, as indicated,
23	the parties will move on down the hall to another
24	
	meeting room to review the various documents.

1	address in this prehearing conference at this time?
2	MR. TRIERWEILER: No, Commissioner, other than
3	to point out that the meeting room that you
4	described is the IA room, Room 105. And we will be
5	conducting a brief review of the contents of the
6	settlement agreement and we would like to meet
7	within 10 minutes adjournment of this hearing.
8	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Parties, do we have
9	other comments, other matters?
10	MS. KEATING: If I may, Commissioner.
11	We just want to thank the staff for working
12	with us. This has been a collaborative effort with
13	FEA and OPC, and we think we've reached a good
14	settlement, that it's in the public interest.
15	And we will have our witnesses available to
16	address any staff questions, and we will work
17	diligently to make sure staff has all the
18	information they need to move this forward and to
19	bring this before you with all the information you
20	need for March 26th.
21	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, Ms. Keating.
22	Comments by others at this time?
23	MS. PONDER: Yes. I just would like to
24	address if our witnesses may be excused at this
25	time, or is that to be addressed later?

1	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Staff? Ms. Helton.
2	MS. HELTON: I think until we see the
3	procedural order and see what process is expected,
4	I am not comfortable recommending, Commissioner,
5	that we excuse any witnesses.
6	MS. CHRISTENSEN: When will we be getting
7	that?
8	MS. PONDER: I am sorry, when will the new
9	procedural order be out?
10	MS. HELTON: Hopefully hopefully soon.
11	MS. PONDER: Okay.
12	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: I am sorry, turn your
13	mic on, please.
14	MS. CHRISTENSEN: We would just appreciate any
15	effort that could be made in processing that as
16	quickly as possible so that we don't have to
17	actually bring our witnesses down if the Commission
18	doesn't have any questions of our witnesses. I
19	think it would save the State money if we don't
20	have to have them attending the hearing for no
21	purpose.
22	Thank you.
23	MR. TRIERWEILER: Commissioner, if I may. I
24	would like to address that issue.
25	That's a very important issue. We appreciate

1	wanting to avoid the cost and bother the witnesses
2	who have already participated so robustly in this
3	process, and we will identify as quickly as we can
4	which, if not all witnesses, that can be that we
5	recommend be released prior to the technical
6	hearing just as soon as we can.
7	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, sir.
8	Any other comments or concerns at this point?
9	Okay. As staff has indicated, having just
10	received the actual document here, staff will be
11	working diligently reviewing that, and I am
12	available right away to execute the amended
13	procedural order. So we will get that out just as
14	quickly as we can.
