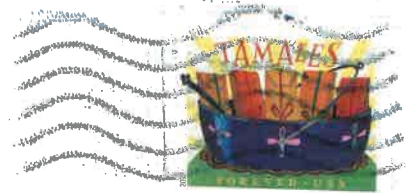
Duke Energy asks for rate increase to pay for project

Duke Energy Florida on Monday asked state regulators to approve rate increases to pay for a new Citrus County power plant. Duke plans to operate the first unit of the natural-gas fired plant in September and the second in November. Duke will shut down two coal-fired generating units at Crystal River after the new gas plant starts operating. Duke said Monday that residential customers who use 1,000 kilowatt hours of electricity a month would see a \$3.61 bill increase in October and a \$2.27 bill increase in December. The state Public Service Commission will decide whether to approve the increases. Duke said the project would help reduce carbon emissions.

The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your correspondence regarding Duke Energy Florida (DEF) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has authority in the telephone industry which is limited to the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. We appreciate the opportunity to assist you.
