Complaint: Improper Billing against K W Resort Utilities Corp.

Details:

This complaint is on behalf of myself and many angry residents of Stock Island, FL due to the unreasonable rate increase recently granted to KW Resort Utilities by the PSC.

This increase makes the average sewage bill nearly \$100/month. In the wake of Hurricane Irma, this insane increase adds insult to injury and will only serve to exacerbate our already serious staffing problems in the Keys.

It now appears that KW Resort Utilities, is accomplishing its goals of overcharging customers, with the approval of the PSC. Serious questions are now raised as to the relationship of the two parties due to this irrational decision.

Also, KW Resort Utilities has a flawed billing methodology that is based charging for the actual fresh water usage. It is not feasible to think that all water goes into the sewer system and should NOT be billed as such.
