1	PROCEEDINGS
2	(Transcript follows in sequence from
3	Volume 3.)
4	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. It is nine
5	o'clock. If everyone will take their places. We
6	will reconvene this hearing this morning.
7	I think I know where we left off, but I
8	think we might have a couple of preliminary matters
9	to begin with this morning. Mr. Bernier, you or
10	Mr. Rehwinkel, you want to go first? Mr. Bernier.
11	MR. BERNIER: I don't know, Charles, if you
12	want to go.
13	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Charles.
14	MR. REHWINKEL: Yes. Mr. Chairman, thank you,
15	and good morning.
16	We wanted to take up some preliminary matters
17	with the Commission, but we have a preliminary
18	preliminary matter to ask you about, which would be
19	that as a result of some initial conversations that
20	we've had overnight and today, we have made we
21	have approached the company and asked them to
22	explore an option, and they've agreed to at least
23	explore it. And I think to explore it, at least
24	initially, they would need maybe 30 minutes. And
25	Mr. Bernier can speak to that. But if that's the

1	amount of time we need, we would ask the Commission
2	to give us leave to do that and come back to you
3	and either address their output of that or continue
4	with the hearing.
5	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Mr. Bernier.
6	MR. BERNIER: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I can agree
7	with what Mr. Rehwinkel has said, that they have
8	presented an option that we would like to take a
9	look at, but to do that, I need about a half hour
10	to confer with my client, and then we can come
11	back, or possibly I may be in a position where I am
12	coming back and asking for a little bit more time
13	just based on availability, but I think a half hour
14	should get us where we need to be.
15	COMMISSIONER CLARK: The parties are all in
16	agreement?
17	MR. BREW: Yes.
18	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Staff, any issues
19	or problems?
20	Commissioners? Chairman Graham.
21	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: It's always interesting to
22	me the things that people come up with not to start
23	at nine o'clock in the morning. Some people just
24	are damned determined to start at 9:30.
25	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Valid point, Mr.

1	Chairman.
2	All right. We will stand in recess for 30
3	minutes.
4	MR. BERNIER: Thank you, sir.
5	(Brief recess.)
6	COMMISSIONER CLARK: We will stay in recess
7	for 10 more minutes.
8	(Brief recess.)
9	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. We will call
10	the meeting back to order.
11	I understand that the parties may have reached
12	some stipulations.
13	Mr. Rehwinkel, would you like to go first?
14	MR. REHWINKEL: Yes, Mr. Chairman.
15	I was prepared to announce a stipulation, but
16	based on the rain and the fact that we are going to
17	be here, we are just going to go ahead.
18	MR. BERNIER: I object.
19	MR. REHWINKEL: And I don't have an umbrella.
20	No, in all seriousness, I would like to thank
21	the Commission for giving us the time to continue
22	the discussions that we began today. We put that
23	time to good use, and after discussions with Duke,
24	the Florida Retail Federation, PCS Phosphate and
25	the Office of Public Counsel, who are the consumer

1	parties who have positions on the issue dealing
2	with the Bartow plant have reached an agreement to
3	do this: To allow the recovery of replacement
4	power costs of \$11.1 million subject to final
5	true-up in a subsequent fuel docket proceeding
б	based on the availability of essential information.
7	And we also agree that Duke will file a
8	revised request for confidential classification for
9	the root cause analysis that is attached to Mr.
10	Swartz's testimony as Exhibit JS-1.
11	That will allow the Commission to resolve
12	Issue 1B. And it will also resolve the fallout
13	issues of 8, 10, 18, 20 and 22. There will be no
14	cross-examination and no briefs filed on those
15	issues I just listed.
16	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.
17	MR. REHWINKEL: And that is the proposal.
18	That would mean that we would could end the hearing
19	after the Commission considers and votes on the
20	stipulation.
21	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. The other
22	parties are in agreement?
23	MR. BREW: Yes, Mr. Chairman. We think it's a
24	fair and very appropriate way to address those
25	issues given where we stand today.

1	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Wright.
2	MR. WRIGHT: Yes, sir. And we agree, and it
3	is a Type 1 stipulation. We are all in agreement
4	and support this one. Thanks.
5	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Mr. Bernier.
6	MR. BERNIER: Yes, sir. DEF agrees as well.
7	And we appreciate the Commission's time while we
8	worked through this, and the parties' willingness
9	to work through the issue with us.
10	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Very good.
11	All right. Ms. Brownless, as I understand,
12	this is basically, from our perspective, would be
13	stipulating 1B, 8, 10, 18, 20 and 22; is that a
14	correct interpretation?
15	MS. BROWNLESS: Yes, sir.
16	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Do you have
17	anything to add?
18	MS. BROWNLESS: No, sir.
19	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Then it's up
20	to the Commission if you would like to make a
21	motion to approve the stipulation agreements.
22	Commissioner Polmann.
23	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, Mr.
24	Chairman.
25	Could I please get clarification on the

1	subject two part of the statement, Mr. Rehwinkel,
2	or staff?
3	You listed the recovery \$11.1 million in a
4	subsequent proceeding. I didn't quite follow the
5	meaning of subsequent, nor was I clear on
6	everything subject to, and perhaps, Mr. Chairman,
7	it would be convenient, if not most clear, if we
8	could simply see that in writing. I am not
9	requiring that, but I sure would like clarification
10	on what I just asked for.
11	MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner Polmann, I hope I
12	read subsequent fuel docket proceeding. The
13	intention is that, based on what we know today,
14	that we would address this issue in the 20190001
15	fuel hearing, and I mean, we've written this up,
16	and it can be reduced to writing for the
17	Commissioners to consider, if that's your pressure.
18	I think the staff has what I read from.
19	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Mr. Wright.
20	MR. WRIGHT: Just to put slight additional
21	clarification on that. There is some concern that
22	we may not have all of the essential information
23	referred to in the stipulation in time to properly
24	address it in next year's hearing this time of year
25	next year. We are completely agreeable that it be

1	in the fuel docket, but and our target is next
2	November, but it might not work that way, depending
3	on how everything else comes out. There is a lot
4	that has to happen before we would be able to
5	litigate that fully.
6	Thanks.
7	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Understood.
8	And, Commissioner Polmann, from your
9	perspective, you would just like to see that in
10	writing just from and Ms. Brownless had written
11	out a draft a copy there. Ms. Brownless, would
12	you share that with Commissioner Polmann?
13	MS. BROWNLESS: Sure.
14	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Did anybody else need to
15	see that as well?
16	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Mr. Chairman, I would
17	ask if I see it that the entire Commission be
18	provided a copy. I am not prepared to vote on this
19	right now without seeing whatever the staff has.
20	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Well, you can
21	share it with the entire Commission.
22	Those are the Ms. Brownless listed out
23	three specific the three specific things that
24	the parties have agreed to. I am assuming you guys
25	were a party to that. It's a pretty simplified

1	agreement.
2	MS. HELTON: And as I understand it, and
3	hopefully this will be helpful. What I understand
4	the parties to be asking today is to allow the
5	recovery of 11.1 replacement power cost, but the
6	substantive decision on the appropriateness of that
7	recovery will be put off until, at the earliest,
8	next year's fuel docket.
9	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Meaning it's subject to
10	true-up.
11	MS. HELTON: Subject to true-up, yes, sir.
12	Brew wants to
13	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Yeah, Mr. Brew.
14	MR. BREW: Yeah, just to the way I would
15	put it is we are agreeable to allowing 11.1 million
16	that the company has requested in the fuel recovery
17	here, but that decision is not final as to the
18	ultimate rate-making.
19	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Right. Okay.
20	All right. Commissioners, any other
21	questions?
22	Okay. Is there a motion to approve the
23	stipulations?
24	COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: So moved.
25	COMMISSIONER CLARK: I have a motion. Is

1	their a second?
2	COMMISSIONER FAY: I will second.
3	COMMISSIONER CLARK: I have a motion and a
4	second to approve the stipulations as presented.
5	Any discussion?
6	On the motion, all in savor, say aye.
7	(Chorus of ayes.)
8	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All opposed?
9	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: No.
10	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Motion carries.
11	All right. That concludes that portion. I
12	believe that takes care of all of the matters. I
13	believe would you like to excuse your witness,
14	Mr. Bernier?
15	MR. BERNIER: Yes, sir. Thank you very much.
16	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. The witness
17	is excused.
18	(Witness excused.)
19	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. I think that
20	takes care of all of the matters related to that.
21	We moved all of the exhibits, correct, Ms.
22	Brownless?
23	MS. BROWNLESS: Yes, sir. We have all the
24	exhibits moved in.
25	I do want to remind the Commission that FIPUG

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	1	has asked to brief the FPL SoBRA issues, and so
	2	their brief will be due on November 16th. The word
	3	limit for the parties' post-hearing brief summary
	4	of position is 50 words. The page limit for the
	5	briefs is 40 pages. And the FP&L SoBRA issues,
	6	which are Issues 2M, 2N, 2P, 2Q, 2R and 2S are the
	7	only remaining issues, and those are all FPL.
	8	COMMISSIONER CLARK: And as I understand it,
	9	the parties waived the briefs on the Duke on the
	10	DEF issue?
	11	MS. BROWNLESS: Yes.
	12	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Correct.
	13	All right. I believe that takes care of all
	14	our matters.
	15	Any party have any other matter to address?
	16	Well, then let me say thank you to each of you
	17	for the diligence that you put into making this a
	18	lot quicker than what we expected this morning.
	19	Thank you all for your cooperation. Y'all have a
	20	great day.
	21	The meeting is adjourned.
