1 PROCEEDINGS 2 Okay. Items No. 17 and 18 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: 3 are a panel. So, let me tell you how we are going 4 to proceed before we start off that panel. We -it's almost 1:00 now. 5 We're going to take up Item 6 No. 17 and 18. We are going to stop for lunch 7 after that. 8 We will reconvene here, probably 9 about 2:40- -- actually, at 2:45. And we will take 10 up IA in this room. And then we'll start the 11 hearing ten minutes after that or so, also in this 12 So, just as long as everybody can plan room. 13 accordingly. 14 That all being said, let's go to Item No. 17. 15 MR. CICCHETTI: Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman, 16 Commissioners. 17 Item 17 is a settlement in lieu of hearing for 18 the tax issues associated with the Tax Cuts and 19 Jobs Act of 2017 for Florida Public Utilities' 20 Company electric division. 21 Last evening, the staff was made aware that, 22 on Page 2 of the recommendation, in the third 23 paragraph, the second sentence, the word "storm" 24 should be "fuel." That said, the parties are here 25 to address the Commission. Staff is available for

1 questions, and the settlement is ripe for a vote this morning if the Commission so desires. 2 3 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, staff. 4 Ms. Keating? 5 MS. KEATING: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Good 6 afternoon, Commissioners. Beth Keating with the 7 Gunster law firm here this afternoon for Florida 8 Public Utilities. 9 Commissioner, this is a very straightforward 10 settlement, which your staff has done an 11 outstanding job of summarizing at Page 2 of their 12 recommendation, with that correction. So, I'll be 13 very brief. 14 First, we'd like to thank OPC for working with 15 the company to bring this in for a landing. We 16 appreciate their diligence and focus on working 17 this through so we're able to resolve this prior to 18 hearing. 19 We'd also like to thank your staff for their 20 assistance and for working with us to get this 21 before you prior to the year's end so that the 22 appropriate rate reductions can be made effective 23 in January. 24 It's a good settlement, Commissioners. Ιt 25 utilizes the company's tax savings to reduce storm (850)894-0828 Premier Reporting

1 costs and fuel costs that otherwise would have been 2 passed on to the customers, and it also 3 contemplates a base-rate reduction beginning 4 January 1, 2019. 5 The parties agreed that the tax-savings 6 amounts have been calculated correctly and that the 7 manner in which these savings will be flowed back 8 to customers is an efficient, practical, and 9 beneficial means for doing so. 10 As such, Commissioners, we respectfully ask 11 that you approve this settlement as being in the 12 public interest. 13 Commissioners, Mr. Cassel and I are here to 14 answer any questions that you may have. 15 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you. 16 Ms. Ponder. 17 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. MS. PONDER: 18 Virginia Ponder on behalf of the Public Counsel and 19 J.R. Kelly, the Public Counsel. 20 First, we'd like to thank Florida Public 21 Utilities Company for its cooperation in working to 22 reach this resolution. The provisions of the 2018 23 tax settlement address the issues associated with 24 the disposition of the tax savings arising from the 25 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017. This agreement

1 represents a reasonable compromise of parties' 2 positions following a lengthy discovery period. 3 The agreed disposition of the funds that are 4 provided by and belong to the customers are being 5 made with the express consent and agreement of the 6 customers. 7 This is fully consistent with the way the 8 customer monies have been handled for the Tampa 9 Electric, Peoples Gas, Duke, and Gulf Power 10 settlements. 11 We believe the 2018 tax settlement in its 12 entirety is in the public interest and is in the 13 best interest of customers and the company, given 14 the facts, circumstances, and posture of the case. 15 We thank you for your consideration of the 16 2018 tax settlement and respectfully request you 17 approve this settlement in its entirety. 18 We are available to answer any questions. 19 Thank you. 20 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, Ms. Ponder. 21 Commissioners, questions, comments, concerns, 22 motions? 23 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Mr. Chairman, 24 Commissioner Clark, I'm so happy to have these 25 customers be able to realize the savings of the tax

1 law by January 1st, 2019. I think this is a case 2 for administrative efficiency, mutually agreeable 3 by the parties. Wish all these tax dockets could 4 be handled before year-end, quite frankly, but I'm 5 happy that we have the settlement before us. 6 And with that, I would move approval of the 7 settlement as presented. 8 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioner Clark. 9 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Second the motion, 10 Mr. Chairman. 11 And I would just echo Commissioner Brown's 12 comments. And I made the statement earlier that I 13 didn't know if I liked settlements or not. T'm 14 still not sure that I do, but -- but I do commend 15 y'all -- you guys for the work that you have done 16 in putting this together. This is an excellent 17 structure and I think it's definitely to the 18 benefit of the customers, and just hope we haven't 19 left anything out. We'll find out later, right? 20 Thank you. 21 I want to know why we passed CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: 22 this law a year ago and the prehearing officer is 23 just bringing this forward. 24 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Office of Public Counsel. 25 (Laughter.)

5	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.

9	(Chorus of ayes.)
10	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any opposed?
11	By your action, you've approved the motion.
12	Thank you very much.
13	Okay. That's 17 down.
