On June 10, 2019, Chesapeake Utilities Corporation (CFG) filed a request for confidential classification for Document No. 04815-2019. This document, found on page 9 (Exhibit A) of CFG's Firm Transportation Service Agreement with Peninsula Pipeline Company, Inc. (Peninsula), identifies maximum daily transportation quantity and the monthly reservation charge. Staff reviewed the document and concurs with CFG that the nature of the information meets the requirements set forth in Sections 366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes, whereby disclosure of the information would harm the competitive business operations of CFG and Peninsula.

Therefore, staff recommends that the request by CFG for confidential classification of Document No. 04815-2019 be approved.
