I understand that you will be setting energy savings goals for the state's largest utilities that will dictate the scale of efficiency programs I and my neighbors are offered for the next ten years. I urge you to stand up for customers by adopting goals that will meaningfully help families cut energy waste and save money on bills. The Power Plant Siting Act unfairly incentivizes large power plants over both distributed generation and energy efficiency which provide significant cost savings to Florida's resident's and businesses.
