QUESTION:

In paragraph 6 of the petition in Docket No. 20180160-EI, FPL states, the VSP Program is successfully increasing visibility and awareness of solar energy through customer engagement and the strategic installation of program facilities. Please describe FPL's current efforts in customer engagement, aside from the construction of new solar structures in high-traffic areas.

RESPONSE:

FPL leverages multiple customer touchpoints through email and social media to engage with existing program participants. This includes:

- Working with the community partners (host locations) to develop exclusive program offers for participants such as free or discounted admissions to local area attractions such as zoos and museums. Attachments 1, 2 and 3 provide examples of such events and programs.
- Program participants are invited to attend community events held at the host locations such as ribbon-cutting ceremonies etc., that are sponsored by the program. This provides a unique opportunity for FPL to demonstrate the outcome that has emerged as a result of their continued support and to thank participants for their ongoing support. An example of such event- [100 Solar Tree Celebration](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8dtqtoEoc6Q)- can be accessed at <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8dtqtoEoc6Q>.
- The FPL SolarNow program website (www.fpl.com/solarnow) also provides FPL with the ability to engage and educate participants in an informal way. Participants are able to learn about new and existing locations, member events and original content about the program including participant testimonial videos. Participants are able to see firsthand how their support is helping to advance solar energy in local communities throughout Florida. An example of testimonial videos for [Zoo Miami](#) and [Port Canaveral](#) can be viewed at webpages <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=nqTUdH1epGE&t=22s> and (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=R-9Ue2__fyc, respectively.
- A dedicated SolarNow program blog (<https://solarnow.fpl.com/blog/>) is used to keep customers informed about program activities. Attachments 4 and 5 of this response include the September and October 2019 blog posts.
- Quarterly eNewsletters are sent to program participants to provide general program updates, to announce new locations, and to announce special events. Attachment 6 includes two examples of recently issued email newsletters.
- FPL uses regular posts and advertisements on Facebook and Twitter to share information about projects, upcoming events and to encourage enrollment. Social media has generated positive engagement and proved beneficial in spreading the news and updates to a larger audience. Attachment 7 includes several examples of such posts and advertisements.
- Signage at the projects promotes the program and encourages visitors to learn more about solar generation. The Program has projects in 37 cities representing 18 different counties throughout the FPL service territory which are visited annually by over 20 million residents and tourists. Attachment 8 includes examples of brochures that highlight the impacts of the program on local communities.

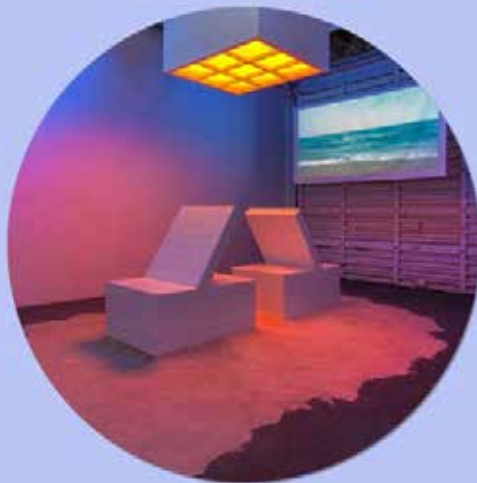

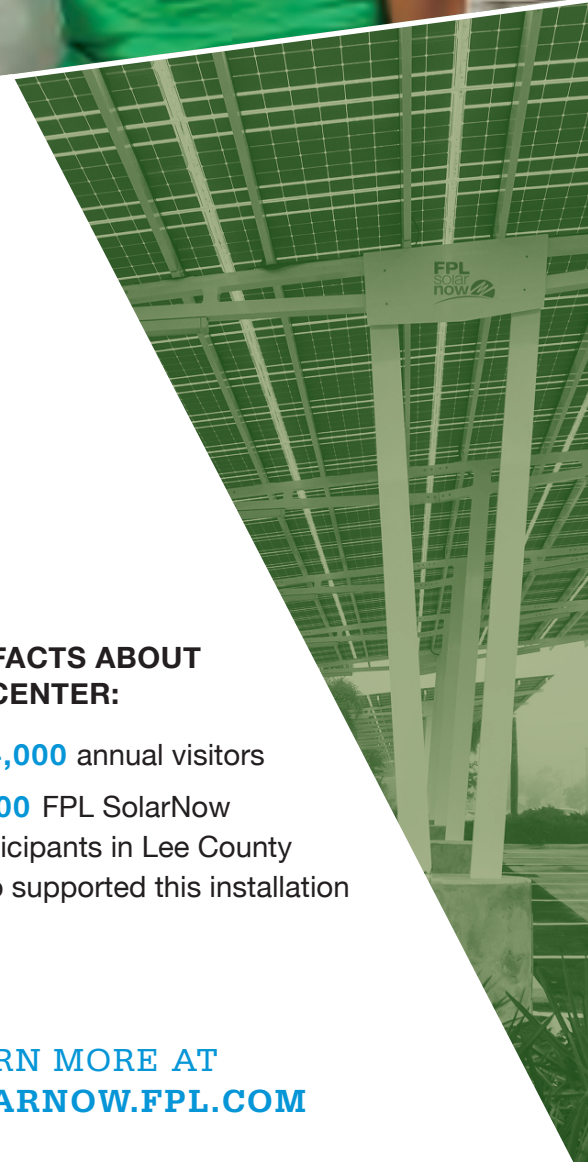

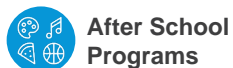
