Dear Florida Public Service Commission,

I ask you to vote in support of FPL's SolarTogether tariff and program.

Today, solar makes up less than 2 percent of FPL's electricity. Florida needs more clean energy offerings like SolarTogether that lower overall electric system costs by \$250 million dollars, add clean, fuel-free resources to the grid, and give customers more choices when it comes to their sustainability.

Solar power is clean, abundant and affordable, and we need a lot more of it. Floridians want both voluntary subscription offerings like SolarTogether in addition to traditional solar farms that provide energy to the grid.

As the Public Service Commission considers FPL's proposal for the largest utility-sponsored community solar program in the country, I ask energy regulators to weigh the importance of this offering particularly for low-income customers, who today lack access to many traditional clean energy offerings.

Today, 1.4 million FPL customers spend more than a tenth of their income on energy bills. This program is a very important first step to unlocking solar savings for those customers who are most in need of energy bill relief.

I ask the Commission to adopt this ground-breaking program and bring more solar to the Sunshine State.
