DUKE ENERGY FLORIDA LLC'S REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION

Duke Energy Florida, LLC ("DEF" or "Company"), pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), submits this Request for Extension of Confidential Classification for certain information provided in its response to Office of Public Counsel's ("OPC") Second Set of Interrogatories (Nos. 11-14), served in docket no. 20170001-EI. The confidential documents were submitted in docket no. 20180001-EI on November 1, 2018. In support of this Request, DEF states:

- 1. On November 20, 2018, DEF filed a Request for Confidential Classification for information contained in its response to OPC's Second Set of Interrogatories (Nos. 11-14), specifically question 12 (document number 07205-2018), which includes sensitive confidential business information such as terms of the settlement agreement.
- 2. DEF's November 20, 2018, Request was granted by Order No. PSC-2018-0597-CFO-EI on December 21, 2018. The period of confidential treatment granted by that order will expire on June 22, 2018. The information continues to warrant treatment as "proprietary

confidential business information" within the meaning of Section 366.093(3), F.S. Accordingly, DEF is filing its Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.

- 3. DEF submits that the portions of information provided in its response to OPC's Second Set of Interrogatories (Nos. 11-14), identified in Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "C" to the November 20, 2018 Request¹ continues to be "proprietary confidential business information" within the meaning of section 366.093(3), F.S. and continue to require confidential classification. See Affidavit of Jeffrey Swartz at ¶ 4, attached as Revised Exhibit "D". This information is intended to be and is treated as confidential by the Company. The information has not been disclosed to the public. Pursuant to section 366.093(1), F.S., such materials are entitled to confidential treatment and are exempt from the disclosure provisions of the Public Records Act. See Affidavit of Jeffrey Swartz ¶¶ 5-7.
- 4. Nothing has changed since the issuance of Order No. PSC-2018-0597-CFO-EI to render the information stale or public such that continued confidential treatment would not be appropriate. Upon a finding by the Commission that this information continues to be "proprietary confidential business information," it should continue to be treated as such for an additional period of at least 18 months and should be returned to DEF as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. *See* §366.093(4), F.S.
- 5. WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, DEF respectfully requests that this Request for Extension of Confidential Classification be granted.

AFFIDAVIT OF JEFFREY SWARTZ IN SUPPORT OF DUKE ENERGY FLORIDA'S REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority duly authorized to administer oaths, personally appeared Jeffrey Swartz, who being first duly sworn, on oath deposes and says that:

- 1. My name is Jeffrey Swartz. I am over the age of 18 years old and I have been authorized by Duke Energy Florida (hereinafter "DEF" or the "Company") to give this affidavit in the above-styled proceeding on DEF's behalf and in support of DEF's Request for Extension of Confidential Classification (the "Request"). The facts attested to in my affidavit are based upon my personal knowledge.
- I am the Vice President of Florida Generation in the Fossil Hydro
 Operations Department. This section is responsible for overall leadership and strategic
 direction of DEF's power generation fleet.
- 3. As the Vice President of Florida Generation, I am responsible, along with the other members of the section, for strategic and tactical planning to operate and

maintain DEF's non-nuclear generation fleet, generation fleet project and additions recommendations, major maintenance programs, outage and project management, and retirement of generation facilities.

- 4. DEF is seeking an extension of confidential classification for certain information provided in its response to OPC's Second Set of Interrogatories (11-14), specifically question 12, submitted on November 1, 2018 in docket no. 20180001-EI. There are no changes to the information contained in DEF's confidential Exhibit A, redacted Exhibit B, and justification matrix C (document no. 07205-2018). The referenced Exhibits are on file with the Clerk. DEF is requesting an extension of confidential classification of this information because it contains proprietary confidential sensitive business information, the disclosure of which would impair the Company's efforts to contract for goods or services on favorable terms and impair the Company's competitive business interests.
- 5. The confidential information at issue relates to a settlement agreement, the terms of which require both DEF and its counterparty to maintain its confidentiality; therefore the agreement qualifies as proprietary and confidential business information. The information has been deemed confidential business information by DEF and its counterparties, the disclosure of which would impair the Company's ability to negotiate favorable terms and conditions. Furthermore, the information at issue relates to the competitive interests of DEF and its counterparties, the disclosure of which would impair the Company's competitive business interests and the interests of DEF's customers. DEF has kept confidential and has not publicly disclosed the confidential information pertaining to its settlement agreement. Without DEF's measures to maintain the

confidentiality of this sensitive business information, DEF's ability to contract with thirdparties would be undermined.

- 6. Upon receipt of its own confidential information, strict procedures are established and followed to maintain the confidentiality of the terms of the documents and information provided, including restricting access to those persons who need the information to assist the Company, and restricting the number of, and access to the information and contracts. At no time since receiving the information in question has the Company publicly disclosed that information. The Company has treated and continues to treat the information at issue as confidential.
