Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Duke Energy Florida, LLC (DEF or Company) requests confidential classification of certain information filed in the Company's petition in the above referenced docket, dated May 29, 2020. The Company is claiming confidentiality of Exhibits MGS-2, MGS-4, MGS-6, MGS-8, and MGS-10, to the direct testimony of Matthew G. Stout (Stout Exhibits) under Section 366.093(3)(d) and Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S.

Per the Statute, proprietary confidential business information includes, but is not limited to: Subsection (d) "[i]nformation concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms," and Subsection (e) "[i]nformation relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information." The information provided in the Stout Exhibits for which confidential treatment is being sought can be described as the estimated costs for major equipment, balance of system, and land to be purchased by the Company for solar generating facilities.

Staff has reviewed the information DEF filed in the Stout Exhibits. It is staff's opinion that the information that is the subject of this request meets the criteria for confidentiality contained in Section 366.093(3)(d), F.S. and Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S.
