Dear Commissioner Gary F. Clark,

As a homeowner who is installing a grid-tied photovoltaic system at my home, I am relying on continuation of current net-metering policies to recover the cost of my system. Without net-metering my system, which will cost me over \$18,000 to install, will become an economic burden that my family can ill-afford to carry. If you eliminate the current net-metering policy, you will severely affect my financial well-being for the next 15-years as the system will likely be unable to recover my expenditures.

I understand that the goals of the monopolistic utilities are to stifle competition and to kill all resident solar power so these monopolies are the only providers of solar and fossil-fuel generated electricity. This will be the first step in providing the utilities the power to once again completely monopolize energy production if you approve elimination of current net-metering policies.

For owners of grid-tied solar systems, change from current net-metering policies will economically drive them to install battery backup systems in their homes. This will further reduce their demand on utility-provided electricity to the detriment of utility profits and lead to additional utility expenses through building additional utility generated electricity harming all utility customers. Additionally, elimination of the current net-metering provisions will greatly financially burden residential owners of PV systems who expected to pay for their systems using savings from their utility bills. For those who are producing as electricity much as they consume or more on an annual basis, elimination of current net-metering policies will additionally financially burden them as they will invest in battery backup systems to store the energy they are generating because they will not be able to rely on net-metering in a grid-connected system. As the grid will be used less for grid-tied systems these owners' will further reduce demand on utility-produced power and shift even more burden to non-solar customers for maintenance of the grid.

This is a naked attempt to kill residential solar by the monopolistic utilities by making residential solar prohibitively expensive to most Floridians except for the very wealthy who can afford to pay \$30,000 cash for a battery backed up system. It will kill the market for and the jobs and businesses of residential installation firms, and you will be signing the death warrant.
