Dear Florida PSC Commissioners,

I noticed that the PSC has a workshop scheduled on September 17 to discuss Customer-Owned Renewable Generation.

Residential and Commercial rooftop solar generation is a tremendously successful program in Florida under the current net-metering rule of the PSC. Net metering is an incentive for Floridians to install solar on their roofs, bearing the initial capital expense. This allows public owned utilities to avoid the huge capital cost of new generation facilities. If there are any changes, the net metering rule should increase the incentive for residential and commercial installation of solar that feeds back into the energy grid.
