We have been generating 90% of the power we need for our home using rooftop solar since 2016.

Net Metering is the regulatory policy that makes this solar system possible. When we generate electricity that we cannot immediately use, we sell it onto the grid for others who need it. And at night, when we cannot generate our own power, we buy that electricity back from the utility.

Eliminating Net Metering would create an unfair and unsustainable condition where we would be giving away energy during part of the day, but still paying full price to buy it back later.

Our decisions to buy solar equipment in the first place were entirely based on the fair system of being able to sell power during the day to buy it back at night. Without Net Metering, we never would have purchased our solar equipment to begin with: the cost of ownership would then be too high.
