The Public Service Commission staff's habit of leaving for jobs from the very companies they are authorized to regulate has always brought into question their ethics and judgment. But their latest recommendation makes me shake my head in disbelief. With the PSC decision looming on Utilities Inc.'s consolidation rate increase Aug. 3, the

staff is supporting a \$5.5 million increase, with more than \$4 million, or 70 percent-plus, coming from customers in Seminole, Orange and Lake counties. One system, in Orange, would see a 212 percent rate increase. We should not subsidize Utilities Inc.'s 16 separate systems. State law requires a "reasonable and not unfairly discriminatory" rate. Public Service commissioners, abide by the law: Say no to these obscene rate increases.

My water bill averaged \$50 before the last major increase. It is currently averaging around \$100 and going to \$125 plus per month if this increase is passed.....assuming 5000 gallons.
