CUSTOMER COMMENTS

"Our association/community of 2,600 homes, built in the 1970's, would like to be sure any increased costs we pay (rates have tripled already) go directly to updating our Wekiva Hunt Club Community Association's 40 year old infrastructure and the Sanlando plant that services us. At a minimum our community contributes \$1,872,000 in rate increases per year. This is based on an old average rate of \$30/month and a current average rate of \$90/month for a two person household. Many households have substantially higher rates than this example."
