### FAR NOTICE OF DISPOSITION OF WAIVER

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Florida Public Service Commission that Gibson Place Utility Company, LLC's petition for waiver of Rule 25-30.033(1)(p) and (q), Florida Administrative Code, filed July 22, 2020, in Docket No. 20200185-WS – Application for certificates to provide water and wastewater service in Lake and Sumter Counties was approved by the Commission by Order No. PSC-2020-0473-PAA-WS, issued November 24, 2020, consummated by Order No. PSC-2020-0500-CO-WS, issued December 16, 2020. The rule addresses the requirement that water and wastewater utilities applying for an Original Certificate of Authorization and Initial Rates and Charges provide, as part of their application, 1) support for their proposed rates and charges and 2) a proposed tariff. The petition was approved on the basis that the purpose of the underlying statute would be achieved by other means and application of the rule would create substantial hardship. Notice of the petition was published in the FAR on August 5, 2020.
