I am writing to you as a property owner in the Cape Haze Development which is within the service area contained in the application from Environmental Utilities, LLC [EU] for central sewer.

I object to EU's request for the bifurcation of the certificate and rate-making proceedings and I object to the granting of a temporary waiver of Rule 25-30.033(1)(p) and (q).

Given the inadequate information regarding the applicant's financial strength and management experience as well as the costs to the stakeholders involved with this project, the applicant's request for a waiver should be denied. As a stakeholder in the proposed service area, it is important to have all the relevant information regarding the proposed central sewer, including the proposed rates, connection fees and the type of system intended for installation.

Cape Haze is in the Charlotte County Utilities (CCU) service area and as such if sewers are to be installed they should be done under the auspices of CCU.

However, we dispute the generalized findings in the 2017 Charlotte County Sewer study as to the need to remove our septic tanks and replace them with sewers.
