To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to you as a property owner within the service area contained in the application from Environmental Utilities, LLC [EU] for central sewer. I STRONGLY OBJECT to EU's request for the bifurcation of the certificate and rate-making proceedings and I STRONGLY OBJECT to the granting of a temporary waiver of Rule 25-30.033(1)(p) and (q).

As a stakeholder in the proposed service area, it is IMPERATIVE TO HAVE ALL THE RELEVANT INFORMATION regarding the proposed central sewer including the proposed rates, connection fees, the type of system intended for installation, etc.. It is my understanding that Charlotte County has an overall sewer plan which includes our area, however, in public meetings with the EU, they seem to prefer installation of a system different than Charlotte County's plan calls for. They also refuse to supply any financial information regarding rates, estimated initial hookup fees, etc. WITHOUT "ALL AVAILABLE INFORMATION", being supplied, it is impossible for us, as stakeholders, to properly evaluate this project – which affects our lives on a daily basis. A last minute release (just prior to the Commission's final approval proceeding) of EU's information pertaining to our sewer project is not what was intended by the state statutes of public information and notice. As stakeholders, we need the Commission to ensure all parties are properly informed throughout the entire process. I therefore request that EU's request for bifurcation and a temporary waiver be denied.
