To Whom It May Concern,

We are property owners on Little Gasparilla Island. We request that the certificate not be granted to Environmental Utilities (EU) for a sewer system. We ask that a PSC engineer study LGI's fragile terrain before certification is considered. Cannot our septic tanks be inspected, renovated, pumped on a regular basis or, in the case of endangerment to our environment, condemned?

- 1. Above all, before certification is granted, EU should have a plan in place for pay over time as opposed to a lump sum. Charlotte County usually spreads this over 20 years.
- 2. We need to know what the monthly rate will be for both fixed and variable fees.
- 3. Who will bear the cost of crushing the septic tank and it's removal? We live on a bridgeless barrier island and a single barge fee can be as high as \$1,000. The cost would be prohibitive for removal. Again, an engineer needs to study our unique problems.
- 4. What kind of sewer system will be installed?

Finally, we object to the certification of Environmental Utilities (EU) or anyone else for a sewer system until we are more informed.
