Dear Mr. Teitzman:

On November 10, 2020, Gulf Power Company (“Gulf”) filed with the Florida Public Service Commission (“Commission”) a Petition for Limited Proceeding for Recovery of Incremental Storm Restoration Costs Related to Hurricane Sally (“Hurricane Sally Cost Recovery Petition”). In its Petition, Gulf requested that the Commission approve Gulf’s proposal to implement a surcharge on customers’ electric bills for storm restoration costs related to Hurricane Sally (“Recovery Charge”) starting on March 1, 2021 and continuing until September 2023, after which Gulf proposed to increase the Recovery Charge, as explained in the Petition. Gulf’s Petition included a tariff sheet establishing a March 1, 2021 effective date for the proposed Recovery Charge.

On December 16, 2020, Gulf submitted a letter to the Commission waiving, on a limited basis and only for the purposes of this proceeding, those portions of Paragraph 7(a) of the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement, approved by the Commission in Order No. PSC-17-1078-S-EI (“Stipulation and Settlement Agreement”), which authorize Gulf to begin recovering eligible storm restoration costs within 60 days of filing an interim cost recovery petition. In its December 16 letter, Gulf explained that it was waiving the 60-day timeframe contemplated by Paragraph 7(a) of the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement so that the Commission could take up the Hurricane Sally Cost Recovery Petition at the Commission’s March 2, 2021 Agenda Conference.

In light of its December 16, 2020 letter and the fact that the Commission will take up the Hurricane Sally Cost Recovery Petition at the March 2, 2021 Agenda Conference, Gulf herewith encloses a new proposed tariff sheet which updates the tariff sheet included with the November 10, 2020 filing. The new tariff sheet establishes a proposed effective date of March 2, 2021, instead of March 1, 2021, for the proposed Recovery Charge. The new tariff sheet is provided in both legislative and clean formats. Gulf kindly requests that you replace the tariff sheet included with the November 10, 2020 filing with the enclosed document. There are no other changes to Gulf's filing.

DETERMINATION OF INTERIM STORM RESTORATION RECOVERY SURCHARGE

The Interim Storm Restoration Recovery Surcharge is designed to recover incremental storm-related costs incurred by the Company related to Hurricane Sally. The factor is applicable to the Energy Charge under the Company's various rate schedules.

Interim Storm Restoration Recovery Surcharge factors are shown below:
