1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN CLARK: All right. Moving to Item
3	No. 2, fuel and purchased power cost recovery
4	clause.
5	Mr. Futrell, would you introduce the item,
6	please?
7	MR. FUTRELL: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Good
8	morning Commissioners.
9	Item 2 is staff's recommendation on Florida
10	Power & Light Company's petition for a midcourse
11	correction to its approved fuel cost recovery
12	factor.
13	Midcourse corrections may be approved by the
14	Commission between fuel clause hearings whenever
15	costs deviate from revenues by a significant
16	margin. In this instance, the currently projected
17	price of natural gas has increase relative to the
18	projected price of natural gas embedded in current
19	fuel factors charged by FPL. The traditional
20	approach to addressing midcourse corrections,
21	overrecoveries and underrecoveries spread total
22	amount in the remaining months in the calendar
23	year.
24	FPL seeks approval to recover the midcourse
25	correction amount from customers over the nine

1	months of April to December 2021. However, as
2	discussed in Issue 2, if the practice of
3	implementing a rate decrease 30 days after the
4	Commission vote is observed in order to provide
5	notice of the decision to customers, new fuel
6	factors would be effective on May 1st, and the
7	amount collected over the eight months of May to
8	December 2021.
9	Representatives of the Office of Public
10	Counsel would like to address the Commission.
11	Representatives of FPL and other parties may wish
12	to respond and are available for questions, as is
13	staff.
14	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Futrell.
15	Mr. Rehwinkel.
16	MR. REHWINKEL: I think Stephanie Morse is
17	here to speak, but all we wanted to say is that we
18	support staff recommendation on Issue 2 as to the
19	timing.
20	CHAIRMAN CLARK: All right. Thank you, Mr.
21	Rehwinkel.
22	Ms. Morse, are you on the line? I am sorry, I
23	had Mr. Rehwinkel's name on my notes here. Ms.
24	Morse, are you on the line?
25	MS. MORSE: I am on the line. Thank you

1	thank you for recognizing me. I was on mute. I am
2	sorry.
3	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Ms. Morse, we can't hear
4	anything you are saying.
5	MS. MORSE: Hello, can you hear me now?
6	CHAIRMAN CLARK: We can hear you a little
7	better.
8	MS. MORSE: Hello. I apologize, I don't have
9	anything further to add to what Mr. Rehwinkel said.
10	Thank you.
11	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Okay. Thank you very much.
12	Any other comments from any of the parties?
13	MS. MONCADA: Good morning, Mr. Chairman.
14	This is Maria Moncada.
15	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Good morning, Ms. Moncada.
16	You are recognized.
17	MS. MONCADA: Thank you. Thank you for
18	recognizing me, and thank you for the opportunity
19	to address you this morning.
20	FPL appreciates the review and the
21	recommendation provided by staff, and in
22	particular, the deliberate care with which they
23	considered this matter on a tight turnaround.
24	We continue to maintain that it is appropriate
25	and permissible to implement a lower midcourse

1	correction having an effective date of today under
2	the facts of this case, particularly in view of the
3	fact that the notice has been provided to customers
4	over the past month. However, even with that being
5	said, FPL does not object to the May 1 effective
6	date proposed by staff in its recommendation should
7	the Commission to vote to accept the staff rec in
8	full.
9	Thank you.
10	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Thank you, Ms. Moncada.
11	Mr. Moyle, I have a note here on my agenda
12	that you are available to address the Commission as
13	well. Any comments?
14	All right. No comments from Mr. Moyle.
15	All right. So Commissioners any questions for
16	staff on this item?
17	There are two options. If we take staff
18	recommendation, we have an effective date of May
19	1st. If we modify that, as is allowed, we could
20	have an effective date of today, April 1st. The
21	effect of that, as I understand it, is simply a
22	reduction of the amount that would be charged for
23	the additional month for recovery. That is for
24	your decision, Commissioners.
25	COMMISSIONER FAY: Mr. Chairman, I am happy to

1	weigh in.
2	COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Mr. Chairman, I don't
3	have a preference one way or the other. I can make
4	a motion for April 1st.
5	CHAIRMAN CLARK: No preference from me.
6	Commissioner Fay, did you have a question?
7	COMMISSIONER FAY: Mr. Chairman, I was just
8	going to opine from my perspective that I thought
9	the staff recommendation addressed the issues that
10	needed to be addressed and even looked at some of
11	the legal precedent to address those, and so
12	although I think we've got probably two different
13	ways we could go here, I think the recommendation
14	makes sense to me, and I was going to move to
15	support that knowing that there is no objection
16	from any other parties.
17	CHAIRMAN CLARK: All right. I will entertain
18	a motion.
19	COMMISSIONER FAY: Mr. Chairman, I move
20	approval of Issue 1 and Issue 2 on Item 2.
21	CHAIRMAN CLARK: I have a motion and a second.
22	Is there any discussion?
23	On the motion, all in favor say aye.
24	(Chorus of ayes.)
25	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Opposed?
