Thank you for the questions. Please see the responses below.

1. Would the State consider removing the restriction on roaming and guest options for Captioned Telephone (CapTel) users? The ability to bring a CapTel to Florida and use it in the State provides functionally equivalent options to those who visit the state for extended periods. (Section B-20. Captioned Telephone Voice Carry-Over)

Response: Substantive changes to the Request for Proposals (RFP) are not permitted post Florida Public Service Commission approval. Per the RFP, roaming and guest options are not allowed.

2. Would the State consider removing the requirement for initialing these items in the checklist? (Section E – Checklist Items 50-55)
