Dear Mr. Robbins:

The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your email regarding Duke Energy Florida (DEF) to the Florida Public Service Commission (FPSC). The FPSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the FPSC. The FPSC has authority in the telephone industry which is limited to the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. We appreciate the opportunity to respond directly to you.

On May 4, 2021, the FPSC approved an Agreement between DEF and other parties to stabilize customer rates through 2024. The Agreement, in part, includes base-rate increases of \$67.25 million in 2022, \$48.93 million in 2023, and \$79.2 million in 2024, for a total increase of \$195.4 million. It also includes caveats that could change the increases, such as a Federal and/or State income-tax change. Residential customers will see a bill increase of approximately 3 to 4 percent in 2022.

Prior to the decision, the FPSC held a hearing and customers had an opportunity to address the Commission. Parties to the Agreement included the Office of Public Counsel, PCS White Springs, Nucor Steel Florida, Inc., and the Florida Industrial Power Users Group.

We will add your feedback to Docket No. 20210016, regarding DEF's Petition for limited proceeding to approve [the] 2021 settlement agreement, including general base rate increases. You may review all the information filed with the FPSC by accessing our website at http://www.floridapsc.com. Tap on the section for Clerk's Office, then Dockets and type in Docket No. 20210016 (just the number). Once you reach the Docket, tap on Document Filings Index to view all the information filed by the utilities and other parties in this Docket.
