CUSTOMER COMMENTS
We have been having an increasing problem with dark rings around the toilet bowl at the water level. It occurs within a week of toilet bowl cleaning. We also have an increasing problem with black mold in our showers although we use exhaust fans during showers and after them. The water occasionally has an odor.

**PROCEDURES AFTER RECEIVING COMMENTS**

Commission staff will prepare a recommendation on the Utility’s proposed rate increase which is tentatively scheduled to be submitted to the Commission on March 24, 2022. The Commission will then vote on staff’s recommendation, taking into consideration customer comments, at its April 5, 2022 Commission Conference. As noted above, customers may address the Commission directly at this Conference. Customers may also watch the Commission Conference live from the PSC website at [www.floridapsc.com](http://www.floridapsc.com). Look for the “Watch Live Broadcast” icon on the left side of the webpage.

The Commission will thereafter issue a proposed agency action (PAA) order containing rates which may be different from those contained in staff’s final recommendation. Substantially affected persons have 21 days from the date that the PAA order is issued to protest the Commission’s PAA order. Customers may obtain a copy of staff’s recommendation and all documents filed in this docket under the Clerk’s Office tab at the Commission’s website (<http://www.floridapsc.com>).
