Dear Commissioners:

We can't take any more higher bills here in North FL. Under FPL we already are in the top three of highest rates in the state among all investor owned and public utilities.

I ask you to find Florida Power and Light's (FPL) preferred 10-year site plan to be unsuitable. The winter weather forecast is extremely unlikely to occur, and there is no sound evidence to back it up.

I know that FPL can pass the full cost of their projects, plus more profit for new infrastructure, onto customers. That motivates FPL to build more than is needed. They are already raising our bills higher than I've seen in my time as a Florida resident. We need you to require FPL to invest in efficiency programs that save us money, save energy, and help us meet our needs when the weather is most unbearable.
