I'm emailing you as I believe the PSC is the agency that approved this new Florida Power and Light minimum billing charge. In reviewing the article, it appears to me that conservation and energy alternative initiatives are being overlooked and in fact punished.

I too had my bill increase by greater than 2 fold due to my conservative efforts. I believe that the existing \$8.99 charge is meant to offset the costs not directly related to producing and delivering electricity. Rather than punishing the small users and/or solar adopters it would be better to increase the price per kilowatt hour to whatever point would cover the additional costs required by FPL. By doing so you would maintain the focus on energy conservation whereas the larger consumers would pay their fair share based on their conservation efforts.
