COMPLAINT INFORMATION

Complaint: Improper Billing against Florida Power & Light Company Details:

In an effort to help the environment, I have installed solar panels on my home. My electric bill has been 9.23 which is a basic price. It has almost tripled as I understand it because the Public Service Commission approved a minimum charge of \$25.00 to customers whose bill is less than \$25.00. This is contradictory to the intent of Florida Statue number 366.92 which states "It is the intent of the Legislature to promote the development of renewable energy; protect the economic viability of Florida's existing renewable energy facilities;..." This new policy which the Public Service Commission has acted to discourage the use of solar panels and place at a disadvantage those that are producing energy by charging them to produce more than they use and thus reducing the cost to utility company in the purchasing of excess energy. I do not think rule was meant for a home that is using power from FP&L and the bill is reduced because of solar energy sold back to the utility. The effect of my bill is that I purchased more than \$25.00 but sold back electricity. So my situation would be in direct violation of the net meter legislation in my opinion.
