My son is sending this email for me to oppose the increase for the Storm Protection Plan by FPL on the PSC conference agenda Aug. 2, 2022.

I am 90 years old and am happy to say I still live by myself. I was raised to be frugal, like my house at 80 in the summer time, turn all my lights off when not in use, only do 2 loads of laundry once a week and do not use my oven. I have changed no habits, yet I am paying more this year than last because of the PSC allowing FPL to increase the rates when they took over for Gulf Power on Jan. 1, 2022. Needless to say I only have my social security income.

"The Florida Public Service Commission in October unanimously approved a four-year rate settlement allowing FPL to raise rates in 2022 to generate an additional \$692 million in revenue, followed by increases in 2023 that will another generate \$560 million." NWF Daily News, Feb. 12, 2022.

I am pleading with the PSC to **not allow** FPL to get another increase for the Storm Protection Plan. They are generating enough revenue and we in the Panhandle are suffering because of it. Quite a bit of Shalimar already has underground wiring.
