Please do not raise FL7L rates. I have a solar set-up that produces more electricity than I use each year. This year I sent 2,503 kWh to the grid. FP&L is reimbursing me \$112.06. They will charge other customers \$301.84 for the energy I sent. In addition to my only getting 37% of the consumer cost of the energy, I paid \$209.99. This payment is actually only for insurance that I will have the grid power in an emergency. However, there is no emergency coming my way that my solar panels and PowerWalls will not cover. If I had a choice, I would not pay this fee, because I am getting nothing for it.

FP&L is doing everything in its power to discourage people from installing their own solar power systems. FP&L does not provide solar produced electricity to its Florida customers. It sells that electricity to out-of-state vendors. PLEASE do NOT grant FP&L's request for increasing rates to the consumer.
