Pursuant to Section 366.093 of the Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light (FPL or Company) requests an extension of confidential classification of certain information filed in the above-referenced docket, dated April 6, 2021.

The Company is claiming confidentiality of its information under Section 366.093(3)(b), Section 366.093(3)(d) and Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S. Per the Statute, propriety of confidential business information includes, but is not limited to: Subsection (b) "[i]nternal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors." Subsection (d) "[i]nformation concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms." Subsection (e) "[i]nformation relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of information."

More specifically, the information consists of data related to employee compensation, disclosure of which could affect the utility's ability to attract and retain employees. Other information consists of internal audits. In addition, some of the information contains credit agency ratings, loan agreements, insurance contracts, proprietary third-party vendor information, tax returns and schedules, solar panel pricing information, heat rates, and outage schedules. FPL asserts that if this information is publicly disclosed, such disclosure could harm the competitive interests of the provider of the information.

Staff has reviewed the subject information as well as the Company's extension of confidentiality request, and in staff's opinion, the request meets the criteria for an extension of confidentiality contained in Section 366.093(3)(b), Section 366.093(3)(d) and Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S.
