My name is Rick Freedman and I live at 751 NW 201 Avenue, Pembroke Pines, Florida. FPL is my utility carrier.

In April of 2022, I used 2539 kwh and my bill was \$363.59

In April of 2023, I used 2728 kwh and my bill was \$467.13

How is that even remotely possible?!

I used 7% more kwh in 2023, but my bill went up by 29%.

Please explain to me how this is even legal. Did your Commission approve a rate increase that would result in my average bill going up by almost 30%? Should I expect these same astronomical increases to continue going forward and if so, for how long?

This is ridiculous.
