We completely lost the house in Hurricane Ian. It is still not rebuilt. We are already under a lot of financial stress, and have already paid for a brand new septic system. We should not have to bear another, incredibly hefty cost to connect to sewer. With central sewer, we would be at the mercy of a for-profit utility company, instead of being self sufficient.

Despite the house being destroyed to the point of needing to be torn down, there was no breach of the septic system. Can the same be said for sewer when the next strong hurricane comes through? Also, it is my understanding that

Environmental Utilities, LLC has never owned a wastewater utility before. Please do not make us a guinea pig so that these people can make money. We do not want sewer and have never requested it.
