To The Clerk at PSC State of Florida. Regarding Docket Number 20240026-EI, Teco Rate Increases through 2027.

FPSC [has] outlined the TECO proposal so customers will have a better understanding of what they may pay. For a home using about 1000 kWh, they are currently paying an average of \$136 a month. In January of next year, that may go up to \$154. For a home using 1500 kWh, they pay about \$205 a month right now. In January, they may cough up about \$225. For those using 2000 kWh, they currently pay about \$273 and they too may face about a \$20 increase. If anyone does the math from the rate increase inserts in their last bill rates will be raised much higher than \$20; Teco, I am not surprised to say, has not done their calculations correctly again.

We Teco customers in Florida, and electric usage customers across America, have been forced to pay more for less for everything including utility rates. Why should Teco be allowed to not have to do more with less or, to be fair, to do more with what they have?
