ORDER GRANTING DUKE ENERGY FLORIDA, LLC'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION (DOCUMENT NO. 01547-2024)

On April 2, 2024, pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), Duke Energy Florida, LLC (DEF) filed a Request for Confidential Classification (Request) of information contained in Exhibit Nos. SC-3, SC-4, SC-5, and SC-7 of Shannon Caldwell's direct testimony and MFR Schedule D for Test Years 2025, 2026 and 2027 – Cost of Capital (Document No. 01547-2024). This request was filed in Docket No. 20240025-EI.

Request for Confidential Classification

DEF contends that the information contained in Document No. 01547-2024 constitutes proprietary and confidential business information entitled to protection under Section 366.093, F.S., and Rule 25-22.006, F.A.C. DEF asserts that this information is intended to be and is treated by DEF as private and has not been publicly disclosed. More specifically, the information relates to the DEF's regulated and non-regulated affiliates' capital structures and information regarding internal compensation procedures, incentives, valuations and costs.

Ruling

Section 366.093(1), F.S., provides that records the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission) has found to contain proprietary business information shall be kept confidential and shall be exempt from Chapter 119, F.S. Section 366.093(3), F.S., defines proprietary confidential business information as information that is intended to be and is treated by the company as private, in that disclosure of the information would cause harm to the company's ratepayers or business operations, and has not been voluntarily disclosed to the public. Section 366.093(3), F.S., provides that proprietary confidential business information includes, but is not limited to:

- (d) Information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms.
- (e) Information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information.
