1	PROCEEDINGS
2	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: All right. Good
3	afternoon, everyone. Today is September 9th, 2024.
4	It is 1:00 p.m., and I will now call this
5	Prehearing Conference to order.
6	Staff, will you please read the notice?
7	MR. DOSE: By notice issued on August 28th,
8	2024, this time and place has been set for a
9	Prehearing Conference in Docket No. 20240010-EI.
10	The purpose of the Prehearing is set out more fully
11	in the notice.
12	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Thank you.
13	Let's move to appearances. Florida Power &
14	Light.
15	MR. WRIGHT: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
16	Christopher Wright on behalf of Florida Power &
17	Light. I would also like to enter an appearance
18	for David Lee.
19	MR. BERNIER: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
20	Matt Bernier for Duke Energy, and I would also like
21	to enter an appearance for Stephanie Cuello and
22	Dianne Triplett.
23	Thank you.
24	MR. MEANS: Good afternoon. Malcolm Means
25	with the Ausley McMullen Law Firm for Tampa

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	1	Electric, and I would also like to enter
	2	appearances for Jeff Wahlen and Virginia Ponder.
	3	Thank you.
	4	MS. KEATING: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
	5	Beth Keating with the Gunster Law Firm here this
	6	afternoon on behalf of Florida Public Utilities.
	7	MR. MOYLE: Good afternoon, Jon Moyle for the
	8	Florida Industrial Power Users Group. I would also
	9	like to enter an appearance for Karen Putnal.
	10	Thank you.
	11	MR. BAKER: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
	12	Laura Baker with Stone Mattheis Xenopoulos & Brew
	13	on behalf of White Springs Agricultural Chemicals,
	14	Incorporated, doing business as PCS Phosphate-White
	15	Springs. I would also like to do enter an
	16	appearance for James Brew and Sarah Newman.
	17	MR. BRISCAR: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
	18	Joseph Briscar on behalf of Nucor Steel Florida. I
	19	would like to also enter an appearance for Peter
	20	Mattheis and Michael Lavanga.
	21	Thank you.
	22	MR. REHWINKEL: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
	23	Charles Rehwinkel and Ali Wessling with the Office
	24	of Public Counsel. We would also like to enter an
	25	appearance for Walt Trierweiler, the Public

1	Counsel, Patty Christensen, Octavio Ponce and
2	Austin Watrous.
3	Thank you.
4	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Staff.
5	MR. DOSE: For Commission staff, Daniel Dose
6	and Shaw Stiller.
7	MS. HELTON: And Mary Anne Helton is here as
8	your Advisor. I would also like to enter an
9	appearance for your General Counsel, Keith Hetrick.
10	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Thank you.
11	All right. Preliminary matters. Staff, are
12	there any preliminary matters we need to address
13	before we get to the Prehearing Order?
14	MR. DOSE: Staff is unaware of any preliminary
15	matters at this time.
16	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Do any of the parties
17	have any preliminary matters?
18	MR. MEANS: Commissioner, I would just
19	sorry.
20	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Yes.
21	MR. MEANS: I would just note that we have
22	executed a stipulation with Public Counsel similar
23	to the other parties, but we haven't had a chance
24	to file in the docket yet.
25	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Thank you. Yeah, I

1	think we will we will get to that a little bit
2	later, but I appreciate you guys getting that in.
3	Okay. We are going to go through the draft
4	prehearing order now. I am going to identify
5	sections, and the parties can let me know if there
6	is any corrections or changes that need to be made.
7	And if we move kind of quickly, just, you know,
8	shout out to me and we will fix it.
9	So Section I, Case Background.
10	Section II, Conduct of Proceedings.
11	Section III, Jurisdiction.
12	Section IV, Procedure for Handling
13	Confidential Information.
14	MR. DOSE: Any confidential cross-examination
15	exhibits a party intends to offer will be in paper
16	copies in red folders in the course of the hearing.
17	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay. Thank you.
18	Does any party have any other matters related
19	to confidential information that they would like to
20	address? All right. We'll keep moving.
21	Section V, prefiled testimony and exhibits and
22	witnesses.
23	MR. DOSE: Staff suggests that the witness
24	summary testimony be no longer than three minutes.
25	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Are parties okay with

1	the three-minute summaries? Yep, okay.
2	Section VI, Provision of Exhibits for Hearing.
3	Section VII, Order of Witnesses.
4	Are there any I am sorry, staff. Are there
5	any changes to the order of witnesses?
6	MR. DOSE: Staff is unaware of any changes at
7	this time.
8	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Are there any
9	witnesses that can be stipulated?
10	MR. DOSE: The parties have stipulated to the
11	three PSC staff witnesses, Tomer Kopelvich, Ron
12	Mavrides and Donna Brown.
13	The only other witnesses are those listed by
14	the four utilities. It is staff's understanding
15	that the utilities and intervenors have been
16	working on stipulations for witnesses. The parties
17	would be best suited to speak to the status of
18	those stipulations.
19	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Now, if any parties
20	would like to speak to this witness stipulations.
21	MR. WRIGHT: This is Chris Wright on behalf of
22	Florida Power & Light.
23	So Florida Power & Light, similar to the other
24	utilities, has entered into Type 2 stipulations
25	with Public Counsel. Included in those

1	stipulations is a stipulation to the witnesses and
2	their testimony and exhibits being admitted into
3	the record and, upon Commission approval, those
4	witnesses being excused.
5	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay. And that seems
6	across the board, okay.
7	I think well, I will let staff speak to
8	this.
9	MR. DOSE: If the parties advise staff of any
10	witness stipulations, staff will confirm with each
11	Commissioner that any identified witness can be
12	excused. If Commissioners don't have any questions
13	of these witnesses, the witnesses may be excused
14	from the hearing and their testimony and exhibits
15	entered into the record at the hearing as though
16	read.
17	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Pretty standard, so
18	I'll keep moving if everyone is okay.
19	All right. So we are going to move to Section
20	VIII, Basic Positions. Do any of the parties have
21	any changes to their basic positions? No changes.
22	Okay.
23	Okay. Section IX, Issues and Positions.
24	Staff, do you have any additional comments before
25	we get started with the issues?

1	MR. DOSE: We have received stipulations from
2	Florida Power & Light, Duke and FPUC. We have not
3	heard position statements on these stipulations
4	from FIPUG, Nucor or PCS Phosphate.
5	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: I understand that
6	we've gotten some, you know, some that are, you
7	know, that are taking no position, and things like
8	that. So the way I was thinking about going
9	through, because we do have these stipulations,
10	just kind of taking, with respect to all the
11	issues, kind of taking them as a lump chunk, and
12	then we will kind of go from there for any issues
13	that, you know, comments that you might have
14	regarding one specific issue.
15	MR. BRISCAR: Commissioner?
16	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Yes.
17	MR. BRISCAR: We've Nucor, we've spoken
18	with Duke and OPC, and at least in regards to Duke,
19	we are willing to agree to the Type 2 stipulations
20	that OPC and Duke have entered into. So I think
21	all of our issues, except for 3D, are agree with
22	OPC, so we will change that one to agree with OPC,
23	and that will be how we handle that.
24	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay. And I think
25	the way yes, Mr. Rehwinkel.

1	MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you, Commissioner.
2	The Public Counsel has appreciated working
3	with counsel for all four companies to reach the
4	resolution that we have Mr. Trierweiler has
5	signed. I just it's important for the record to
6	state that we are facilitating a Type 2
7	stipulation, which would mean that the company and
8	the staff would be in agreement on numbers, and we,
9	as it's laid out in the documents, we won't object
10	and we won't we wave all of our post-hearing
11	rights, et cetera.
12	So it's just important that we not use the
13	term entered into a stipulation, that's not what
14	we've done.
15	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Yeah.
16	MR. REHWINKEL: And there is a footnote that
17	we have been, for the last couple of years,
18	including in these orders, if such an arrangement
19	is approved by the Commission, that we would ask be
20	included.
21	So just to clarify, that's that's the
22	posture I think that we are in. And we are we
23	worked diligently with these folks to make put
24	us in this posture, and I think that's what the
25	other parties would be agreeing to.

1	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Right. And I
2	appreciate you clarifying for that for the
3	record, and for all the work that you guys have
4	done to come to those Type 2 stipulations.
5	So from that, I mean, with respect to all
6	issues, any other comments on any
7	MR. MOYLE: I would I would just confirm
8	that what Mr. Rehwinkel represented on behalf of
9	OPC is also the position of FIPUG. We will we
10	will facilitate a Type 2 stipulation. We are not
11	entering affirmatively into a stipulation. And if
12	we could be reflected on the on the footnote,
13	the stipulation footnote
14	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Sure.
15	MR. MOYLE: that would be appreciated.
16	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Yeah. And I think
17	while staff, we'll work towards that. And I think
18	we are we are kind of staff, you can
19	interject here, but if we can have all of those
20	changes by close of business. I know we have been
21	kind of moving by close of business tomorrow.
22	Sorry, you have just so that we can get that all
23	finalized for the Prehearing Order.
24	Staff, please add anything.
25	MR. DOSE: That works. And is this for all

1	the utilities' stipulations?
2	MR. MOYLE: It is for FIPUG, yes.
3	MR. BAKER: And just for the record,
4	Commissioner, I wanted to say, likewise, for PCS,
5	but only for Duke, obviously.
6	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Yes.
7	MR. BAKER: Thank you.
8	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay. Well, with
9	that, any anything additional, staff, or should
10	I
11	MR. DOSE: Nothing further on that.
12	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay. Okay. So
13	okay, like I said, close of business tomorrow, if
14	we can have all of that so that we can synthesize
15	everything. I am going to keep moving on then.
16	Section X, Exhibit List. Staff.
17	MR. DOSE: Staff has prepared a Comprehensive
18	Exhibit List which lists all prefiled exhibits and
19	those exhibits staff wishes to include in the
20	record. The draft list was provided to the parties
21	to see if there were any changes or objections to
22	the CEL, or to the introduction of any of staff's
23	exhibits being entered into the record.
24	At this time, we would like to see if there
25	are any known changes that need to be made to the

1	parties' prefiled exhibits, and if there are any
2	known objections to the entry of staff's proposed
3	exhibits into the record.
4	Staff will continue to work with the parties
5	to work towards stipulating the exhibit list prior
6	to the hearing.
7	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Thank you.
8	Are there any changes to the parties' prefiled
9	exhibits?
10	Are the parties willing to stipulate to
11	staff's cross-examination exhibits listed on the
12	CEL? Is that for the record, yeah, I am getting
13	nods yes for the record.
14	Okay. Thank you, everyone. Let's move to
15	proposed stipulations. Staff, are there any
16	stipulations? I know we've gone over this but
17	MR. DOSE: As mentioned, we received
18	stipulations from Florida Power & Light, Duke
19	Energy and FPUC.
20	MR. MEANS: And, Commissioner, as I mentioned
21	earlier, we have exchanged the signed document with
22	OPC. We just have to file it in the docket, and we
23	will do that today.
24	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay. Great. Thank
25	you.

1	Section XII, Pending Motions.
2	MR. DOSE: There are no pending motions at
3	this time.
4	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay. Pending
5	confidentiality orders, are there any?
6	MR. DOSE: There are no pending there are
7	no pending confidentiality matters at this time.
8	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: All right.
9	Post-hearing procedures.
10	MR. DOSE: Staff recommends that post-hearing
11	briefs be limited to 40 pages should briefs be
12	necessary. Staff recommends that a summary of each
13	position should be included in each post-hearing
14	statement. And if a bench decision is not made,
15	post-hearing briefs will be due on October 25th,
16	2024.
17	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Are all parties in
18	agreement?
19	MR. REHWINKEL: I think, based on the executed
20	documents with all four, and the stipulations and
21	facilitations, that there should not be any
22	post-hearing
23	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Great. Yeah.
24	MR. REHWINKEL: filings.
25	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay. Sounds good.

1	All right. So Section XV would be rulings.
2	Staff.
3	MR. DOSE: Staff recommends that the
4	Prehearing Officer make a ruling that all parties
5	shall be provided three minutes for opening
6	statements.
7	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: All right. We we
8	we all agreed on that earlier. Okay.
9	Okay. Other matters. Are there any other
10	matters to address in this Prehearing Conference?
11	MR. DOSE: Staff has just a few items to
12	address.
13	As we have previously discussed with the
14	parties, prior to the hearing, all nonconfidential
15	prefiled exhibits and testimony will be uploaded
16	onto Case Center. At the hearing, the parties,
17	Commissioners and staff will then have access to
18	those items on Case Center. Staff will also have,
19	in red folders, paper copies of all confidential
20	prefiled testimony and confidential prefiled
21	exhibits. Parties do not have to bring copies of
22	those items.
23	Parties will need to upload nonconfidential
24	cross-examination exhibits in Case Center prior to
25	the hearing by September 13th; we have discussed

1	that process with the parties. However, all
2	confidential cross-examination exhibits or
3	depositions the parties wish to use at the hearing
4	must be provided in the following manner: For each
5	exhibit you intend to sponsor, you must bring 20
6	paper copies. If the exhibit is confidential, each
7	copy will need to be in a red folder.
8	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: All right. Does any
9	party have any additional matters that need to be
10	addressed it?
11	I think the only thing I am going to formally
12	make a ruling that opening statements are are
13	limited to three minutes, because I kind of did
14	that casually, so, okay, for the record.
15	Okay. Well, with that
16	MR. BAKER: Yes, Commissioner. I I
17	apologize. I have not actually conferred with all
18	the parties, but if if we I would ask if PCS
19	could be excused from the hearing, since given that
20	we've facilitated all these Type 2 stipulations,
21	and to avoid travel and but I don't need to
22	take I can file something formal if you need a
23	request.
24	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Right. I think we
25	talked about that earlier. I think that will come

1	through the Chair's office, but I anticipate that
2	that shouldn't be an issue, but we will let let
3	the Chair rule on that. So if you staff, can
4	you
5	MR. DOSE: Staff will contact the Chair for
6	that.
7	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay.
8	MR. BAKER: Okay. I will work through the
9	staff and the Chair. I apologize.
10	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: No. No. Thank you
11	for bringing it to my attention.
12	MR. REHWINKEL: For the record, no no
13	objection to any excusals that are requested.
14	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Okay.
15	MR. MOYLE: And FIPUG will probably also ask
16	to be excused, given that it seems like it will be
17	an introduction of evidence without a lot of
18	consternation or cross-examination.
19	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Right. Yeah.
20	MR. MOYLE: Thank you.
21	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: All right. Sounds
22	good.
23	Okay. Any additional matters?
24	All right. Seeing none, this Prehearing
25	Conference is adjourned. Thank you.
