To whom it may concern:

In response to the recent rate increase proposed by FPL to cover the cost of hurricane Helene and Milton damage, I would ask you to veto a per kilowatt increase in favor of a flat charge levied against each individual account.

Since many homes and businesses now employ solar to zero out bills from FPL, the burden of a per kilowatt charge would adversely affect only some customers and not all. Those affected would generally be the poor since by and large they cannot afford to equip their homes with expensive solar cells. The per kilowatt charge would therefore affect those least able to afford any increase.

So in conclusion, please consider a per account surcharge spread over all rather than a per kilowatt used one. Thank you.
