People that are on FPU, do not have the ability or the choice to seek a different electricity provider, unless they move to the area with West Florida Electric, and that is usually not feasible. There is very limited assistance with electrical bills in this area. I do not see the citizens that HAVE to receive electrical services from FPU will be able to afford this increase, thus having to be without electricity.
