I am concerned about additional stress being placed on the Florida Aquifer from a new water plant demand. This demand will increase opportunity for saltwater intrusion which will damage our supply of raw water supplied from the aquifer. It has been a good while since I reviewed levels in the aquifer, but I am pretty sure that they are much lower than the last time I looked at the maps.

I hope that the decision for this proposal will be based on science and not monetary considerations. I feel placing additional stress on the aquifer will increase the risk of permanent, possibly irreversible damage to our NE Florida water supply.
