As requested by Shannon yesterday, I am below responding to the two questions she wanted answers on today relatred to interim rates for Grenelefe. I have attempoted to restate the questions posed by Staff in both cases and the p[rovided our answers;

Q 1 Are the revenues as shown on the Filing and the 2023 Annual report accurate? Answer; The figures as shown on the 2023 Annual Report for the calendar year are accurate in that they are what we collected for the year. However as noted in our filing there were errors in the billing and metering that caused us to adjust our figures for 2024 to correct what we believe were deficiencies in the prior billings. Therefore the information submitted for 2024 and for the test period used in the SARC filing are accurate and are as we believe the customers should have been billed under existing rates and meterings. In other words we have tried to correct the existing deficiencies in the billings in our test year filing for the SARC.

Q2 Staff believes that the utility must submit information to propose a Service Availability Charge in order to have that considered. If the Utility wants a Service availability charge set for interim we will also need to delay the interim process and will need a waiver from the utility. Answer; The utility proposed that the Commission grant interim Service Availability Charges because we believe ultimately they Commission will have to grant substantial amounts for such charges and the utility currently has zero charges. For the sake of equity we believed that interim service availability charges are in order here. However the utility is in dire need of interim rates because they are not coming close to covering expenses with the current rates which are the lowest in the state. The utility cannot afford to wait any longer for interim rates and is not willing to waive the immediate interim needed for any period of time. So we will not pursue asking for interim Service Availability Charges. We will attempt to at least propose some level of new charges for Service availability in the next few weeks to submit to the Commission as best we can using the criteria outlined in the Commissions rules.
