I already cut back on heating and cooling to keep the bill down as low as possible. I hang my clothes out to save on drying costs. Lights are off if I'm not in the room.

I feel that FPL is wasting the funds coming in by advertising (on Channel 3 WEAR Pensacola daily) and by building solar energy plants.
