**PENINSULA PIPELINE COMPANY’S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL
CLASSIFICATION FOR INFORMATION**

Peninsula Pipeline Company (“Peninsula” or “Company”) by and through its undersigned counsel, pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and consistent with Rule 25-22.006(3), Florida Administrative Code, hereby submits its Request for Confidential Classification for information contained in three exhibits, Exhibits A, B, and C, to its First Amendment to its consolidated Firm Transportation Service Agreement with Florida City Gas (“FCG”) for its Indian River Project, which has been submitted under separate cover today. The information for which the Company seeks confidential treatment is information that is essentially the same information for which the Company requested confidential treatment in Docket No. 20240039-GU, in which the original agreement was approved. It is also similar to that which the Commission has afforded confidential classification in prior cases, namely Order No. PSC-2018-0146-CFO-GU, issued March 19, 2018 in Docket No. 20180015-GU. In support thereof, Peninsula hereby states:

1. Peninsula seeks confidential classification of the highlighted information in Exhibit A to the Firm Transportation Service Agreement ("Contract"), in the line identifying the Total Maximum Daily Transportation Quantity (“Total MDTQ”), the line below identifying the MHTP. In addition, Peninsula seeks confidential classification of the information in the line that

identifies the Monthly Reservation Charge for Segment I and the highlighted amount in the following line, as well as the unauthorized use rate in the second to the last line on that page. With regard to Exhibit B to the Firm Transportation Service Agreement, the Company seeks confidential classification of the highlighted amounts listed for the MHTP and the MDTQ, as well as the highlighted amounts in the right-hand column in the lines pertaining to the years of the contract: Years 1-5, Years 6-10, Years 11-15, and on the following page, for Years 16-20, Years 21-25, and Years 26-30, as well as the Unauthorized Use Rate. With regard the Exhibit C, the Company seeks confidential classification of the information under the header Segment I for Total MDTQ, MHTP, Monthly Reservation Charge (Segment I) and the adjusted reservation charge two lines below. On the following page of Exhibit C, the Company seeks confidential classification of the MDTQ and MHTP, the Monthly Reservations Charges reflected for each identified period of the contract for Segment II. On this same page, the Company seeks confidential classification of the MDTQ and MHTP, the Total Monthly Reservation Charge for Segment III, as well as the Unauthorized Use Rate. This information is directly related to the negotiated rates and terms of the Contract, which both Peninsula and FCG treat as proprietary confidential business information consistent with the definition of that term in Section 366.093, Florida Statutes.

2. The information for which Peninsula seeks confidential classification is information that the Company and FCG both treat as confidential, and that meets the definition of "proprietary confidential business information" as set forth in Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes, which provides:

(3) Proprietary confidential business information means information, regardless of form or characteristics, which is owned or controlled by the person or company, is intended to be and is treated by the person or company

as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to the ratepayers or the person's or company's business operations, and has not been disclosed unless disclosed pursuant to a statutory provision, an order of a court or administrative body, or private agreement that provides that the information will not be released to the public. Proprietary confidential business information includes, but is not limited to:

- (a) Trade secrets.
- (b) Internal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors.
- (c) Security measures, systems, or procedures.
- (d) Information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms.
- (e) Information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information.
- (f) Employee personnel information unrelated to compensation, duties, qualifications, or responsibilities.

3. Release of the referenced information as a public record would reveal the specific rate included in a competitive contract. Disclosure of this information would impair Peninsula's ability to compete for goods and services and provide its competitors with an unfair competitive advantage. As such, Peninsula requests that the Commission protect this information consistent with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code. To the extent of Peninsula's knowledge, this information is not otherwise available in the public domain. Thus, the information meets the definition of "proprietary confidential business information" as set forth in Sections 366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes. As such, Peninsula requests that the Commission protect this information consistent with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.

4. Included with this Request is a highlighted copy of Exhibits A, B and C. In addition, two redacted copies of the document are enclosed.

5. Peninsula asks that confidential classification be granted for a period of at least 18 months. Should the Commission no longer find that it needs to retain the information, Peninsula respectfully requests that the confidential information be returned to the Company.

WHEREFORE, Peninsula respectfully requests that the highlighted information contained in each of Exhibits A, B and C to the executed Firm Transportation Service Agreement with FCG be classified as "proprietary confidential business information," and thus, exempt from Section 119.07, Florida Statutes.
