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Dear Commissioners,

On this record, approval of the proposed project would be unlawful under the Florida Administrative Procedure Act and under Florida Supreme Court Precedent. Fla. Stat. Ch. 120; *Cf. Floridians Against Increased Rates, Inc., v. Clark*, 371 So.3d 905 (Fla. 2023).

And it would violate the Florida and United States constitutions. U.S. Const. amend. V; Fla. Const. art. I, § 9; *Mathews v. Eldridge*, 424 U.S. 319 (1976).

As Governor DeSantis explained, "Strong private property rights are essential to a free society." But this project would unlawfully trample on the property rights of Little Gasparilla residents.

For that reason, it must be **REJECTED**.

My family owns a condo in Hideaway Bay on Little Gasparilla Island. After more than two years and millions of dollars of repairs, Hideaway Bay is finally approaching normalcy following Hurricanes Ian, Milton, and Helene.

But the proposed project would render Hideaway Bay once again uninhabitable. It would impose significant costs on homeowners who are already struggling from the financial impact of the recent hurricanes. And it would cause irreparable harm to the environment and the unique character of Little Gasparilla Island.

All this for almost no upside.

Accordingly, approval of the project would not be in the public interest. On this record, approval would be arbitrary and capricious and not supported by substantial evidence, in violation of the Florida Administrative Procedure Act. Fla. Stat. Ch. 120; *Floridians Against Increased Rates, Inc., v. Clark*, 371 So.3d 905 (Fla. 2023).

Additionally, because Hideaway Bay property owners did not receive adequate notice, approval of this project would violate the Florida and United States constitutions. U.S. Const. amend. V; Fla. Const. art. I, § 9; *Mathews v. Eldridge*, 424 U.S. 319 (1976).

Unlike with Ian, Milton, and Helene, we are not powerless to stop the consequences of this misguided project.

Please help protect the property rights of Little Gasparilla residents and **REJECT** this unlawful project.

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Dear Commissioners,

This is my first time writing to you, though I did attend the recent hearing and spoke in opposition to the proposed sewer project. As an engineer, I find it almost inconceivable that this project is still being considered. There are numerous reasons for my opposition, which I would like to outline below:

1. Exorbitant Costs - My septic system was recently inspected, pumped, and found to have no issues whatsoever. It's less than 10 years old and functioning perfectly. Furthermore, the county continues to issue permits for new septic systems on the island, which raises serious questions about the necessity of this project.
2. Lack of Demonstrated Need - The county nor applicant has not provided evidence of a pressing need for this sewer system. In fact, public records show that municipal sewage systems have caused far greater environmental harm than septic systems ever could. For example, just one lift station in Tampa Bay dumped over 21 million gallons of sewage during recent storms. Across the state, more than 1 billion gallons of sewage have been spilled by public facilities over the past decade—these are verifiable figures.
3. Inexperience of the Applicant - The applicant proposing this private sewer system has no experience operating or maintaining such infrastructure. This raises significant concerns about reliability and accountability. To draw a parallel, even basic services like trash collection are inconsistent on the island—my trash is only picked up once a week, and there were three missed weeks in January due to barge issues. Imagine the chaos in your personal household if trash came once in a MONTH.

Beyond these points, there are other critical factors impacting our community:

- Ferry Congestion - Last week, contractors trying to reach my home to wallpaper a bathroom spent 2.5 hours waiting for the ferry in the morning. When they left at 3 PM, it took them until 5 PM just to get off the island. Ferry congestion is becoming so severe that vendors are increasingly reluctant to work here—a situation that will only worsen with additional infrastructure projects like this one. It is making living on the island almost unbearable, so the residents are expected to wait for 4 hours (on and off) for a run to Publix?
- Power Outages - As I write this email, we are experiencing yet another power outage—our third in just four weeks. Currently, 739 homes are without power (see attached screenshot). This outage began on March 29th at 4:55 AM and remains unresolved as of today. Combined with ferry delays and other logistical challenges, these outages highlight the fragility of our existing infrastructure.

In light of these issues, I urge you to deny this project. The costs, lack of necessity, and logistical challenges far outweigh any potential benefits (it is hard to find A benefit).
